

Prelude

Cooperatives, essential instrument of social and economic policy, are people-centric rather than capital-centered organizations and they bring in cohesiveness, community business sense and enhance social bonding through collective efforts. These have immense potential to deliver goods and services at the grass-root level. With its member driven inclusive approach, the power cooperative sector has of 'termite' in constructive building prosperity together in the country. It has the required capability to ensure equitable and concerted efforts towards enhancing the flow of timely, adequate and door-step



support to various critical infrastructure, input services, irrigation, marketing, processing and community storages. There are around 8 lakh cooperative units in India, out of which 1.90 lakh units are credit cooperatives. Over 6 lakhs non-credit cooperatives carry out activities such as marketing, tourism, hospital, housing, transportation, farming including livestock and dairying to name just a few.


