FROM THE DIRECTOR

In a way, 2019-20 had been somewhat a tragic year for IIPA as it lost its widely respected and beloved Chairman, Shri T.N. Chaturvedi on 5th January 2020. IIPA lost another of its stalwarts on 3rd January 2020, Dr. U. C. Agarwal, former CVC of India who had been a long time life member of IIPA as well as its former Director. Dr C Chandramouli, IAS, Secretary to Government of India, DoPT, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Government of India was elected as the interim Chairman of IIPA.

The sad memories notwithstanding, the academic activities of the Institute intensified in 2019-20. While capacity building and study visit programmes became more diverse and wide ranging in coverage, applied research work especially in problematic areas of Governance, engaged faculty and officers alike at a reasonably pressured pace. Resource mobilisation was a proportionate success helping the Institute to further improve its Annual Accounts. At the end of the financial year (in March 2020), the activities of IIPA slowed down considerably due to the worldwide COVID – 19 pandemic.

In capacity building, the Institute got into the Government's flagship schemes in a big way. Public Policy and Governance for the lateral entrants in the position of Joint Secretaries to Government of India, senior executives of forest officers and civil engineers; Leadership and Team-building Soft Skills for Public Sector Executives; Urban Governance and Implementation of Atal Mission for Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation (AMRUT) related schemes; Administrative Law for senior engineers; e-governance Training of Trainers, customised modules on Change Management and Government Process Re-engineering within the Digital India frame; Gender Sensitivity; Smart-Cities; Climate Change; Consumer Protection and New Public Management specially for scientists—all these training programmes provided the faculty with new learning and teaching opportunities. The Institute has started conducting Management Development Programme for the Judges and other Judicial Officers of Uttar Pradesh. IIPA successfully conducted Mid-Career Training Programme of Indian Revenue Service (Customs and Indirect Taxes) and International training of Probationers of Indian Revenue Services in Europe. International participants are trained from Tunisia, Afghanistan, Vietnam, Ethiopia, Bangladesh, Russia, Nepal, Myanmar, and various other African, Latin American and Middle Eastern Countries under Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) programme of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). In all, IIPA conducted 145 skill development programmes, seminars, workshops, etc. in 2019-20. About 7,191 officers including foreign trainees attended and, the Institute earned about Rs.20.79 crore from training activities alone.

IIPA's Applied Research wing gained a qualitative upswing with specific governance areas of concern. Projects to evaluate and recommend improvements of Minority welfare schemes that threw up inter-Ministerial coordination problems; evaluation of schemes of Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Ministry of Minority Affairs, Department of Posts, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Ministry of Tribal Affairs; assessing the measures to augment the resources of the PRIs, restructuring of Ministry of Home Affairs, Impact Assessment of National Knowledge Network (NKN), Impact Assessment of Multi-Sectoral Development Plans, evaluation of the *Khelo India* Programme, evaluation of the Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED) schemes and studying and recommending systemic improvements in the Consumer Welfare sectors; researching into

regional imbalance in the recruitment process of posts in the Government of India, evaluation of Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY), Capacity Building Strategies for Managing Complex Disasters in the face of Climate Change. On the Urban front, IIPA carried out studies on energy efficiency of eco-cities, city-level studies to assess urban governance issues, processes, innovation and manpower requirement of NDMC. The benefits of decentralised-participative operations were proved in these studies leading to improved efficiency, outreach and higher revenue accretion. The National Consumer Helpline at IIPA expanded its consumer grievance monitoring services by integrating with the Digital India initiative. Our faculty carried out 66 research studies for various Central Ministries and state governments, from which IIPA grossed about Rs.4.64 crores.

Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) has been entrusted with the task of strengthening training and active research in various aspects of tribal welfare, by Ministry of Tribal Affairs (MoTA), Government of India. For this purpose, a Centre of Excellence has been established at IIPA and is named as the Centre of Tribal Research and Exploration (COTREX). Since its inception, it has been the consistent endeavour of the COTREX to work on the given theme, i.e. 'Tribal Research and Exploration' focusing on the issues concerning exclusion, inclusion, marginalisation, etc. of the tribal communities. This Centre of Excellence of Ministry of Tribal Affairs has a special significance being at an Institute – a premier National Institute of Public Governance, which has a key role in providing inputs for policy formulation and governance besides sensitising the Administration. IIPA is also in the process of implementing a project "Climate Smart Governance" sponsored by Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. The main objective of this project is to target selected stakeholders and to sensitise them on climate change issues, adaptation needs and options. A blended capacity building programme on "Climate Smart Governance" was also conducted for middle-level officers.

A number of eminent speakers were invited to a 'Special Lecture Series' conducted by IIPA, on topics of current relevance in 2019-20. Lieutenant General (Retd.) Syed Ata Hasnain spoke on Jammu & Kashmir, Shri Anil Swarup, IAS (Retd.), Former Secretary to Government of India, Department of School Education & Literacy, Government of India, Air Chief Marshal (Retd.) B.S. Dhanoa, Shri Pradeep Bajjal, Former Chairman, Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI), Shri Balvinder Kumar, Member Real Estate Regulatory Authority (RERA) and Former Secretary to Government of India, were some of the renowned personalities who presented their valuable insights on New Education Policy, China, India's Strategic Architecture and other relevant topics.

Trainee delegation exposure visits were organised in Netherlands, Belgium, Switzerland, France, Germany, Australia and New Zealand. Our faculty in addition to conducting training and research, have authored publications and seminar papers and continued to advise various ministries through their lectures, presentations and membership in policy and advisory forums of the government. The 45th Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) commenced on 1st July 2019, which was graced by Hon'ble Chairman of IIPA, Shri T.N. Chaturvedi. The Convocation at the closure of the 45th APPPA was held on 30th April 2020. The convocation address was delivered online by Hon'ble Minister for DoPT, PMO, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh.

On knowledge dissemination front through IIPA publications, the partnership of IIPA

with SAGE has given a new visibility not only to *IJPA* but to IIPA also as *IJPA* copies are now subscribed internationally, even in U.K. and USA. The operationalisation of Digital Repository of IIPA library giving access to its huge resources from remote locations, has helped the Institute spread its wings to far nooks and corners of academic world now. IIPA has also started sending its journal, *Documentation in Public Administration (DPA)* to its members through email.

The previous year, the Institute's main support and client base for academic activities included the Central Government Departments like the Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Urban Development, Department of Consumer Affairs, Department of Science and Technology, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Dr. Ambedkar Foundation, Ministry of Tribal Affairs as also, the Hon'ble High Court of Allahabad and Legal Departments, Government of UP.

The Institute conveys its gratitude to the DoPT and other Ministries at the Centre and states and to all other agencies for their support for the training, research, workshops, seminars and other activities at IIPA which assisted the Government's efforts to continuously upgrade knowledge base and improve quality of public service. We place on record our gratitude and appreciation for the constant support provided by the Hon'ble Vice President of India and President IIPA, the Chairman IIPA and the members of the Executive Council.

The Institute also thanks all the office-bearers of Regional and Local branches, faculty members, Officers and staff of the Institute for their sincere efforts in the overall development of the Institute. We are grateful to all those within and outside IIPA who have assisted us and contributed to the success of our activities and efforts during 2019-20 and look forward to more of the same.

2019-2020

AN OVERVIEW

This Report of the Indian Institute of Public Administration pertains to the year 2019-2020. The Institute undertakes research studies on substantive and contemporary issues as well as in specific areas as sponsored by the governments, national organisations and international agencies. It also offers advisory services in operational areas to government and public sector enterprises. It conducts a large number of training programmes on various aspects and facets of the study and practice of public administration and management and trains about 5000 officers and civil society members every year from India and abroad. It also publishes and disseminates literature on public administration through special publications and journals.

The Report presents the activities of the Institute under the following four major heads:

- Training
- Research Activities
- Information Management
- Associational and Outreach Activities.

TRAINING/EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

The Institute organised a large number of training programmes which broadly fall into the following categories:

1. Long-term Programmes: Includes Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) for senior officers

which is conducted for the Training Division of the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Government of India.

2. Sponsored Programmes: Mainly those sponsored by (a) the Department of Personnel and Training, (b) the Ministry of Urban Development, (c) the Department of Science and Technology, (d) the Department of Consumer Affairs, and (e) other Ministries/Departments, Public Sector Undertakings, etc.
3. Fee-based Programmes: Designed and offered by the Institute at the behest of user organisation as well as at its own initiative.

45th Advanced Professional Programme on Public Administration 2019-2020

Brief Report

The 45th Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA), a high-end customised ten-month programme for senior officers of the All India and Central Services including the armed forces was conducted by the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) from July 01, 2019 to April 30, 2020. Forty six participants participated in the programme. The programme is sponsored by the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Government of India.

Inaugural Session

Inaugurating the programme, Late Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, then Chairman of IIPA, mentioned that APPPA provided an opportunity to the participants from various services and the armed forces to interact, to know and appreciate the background, limitations and difficulties of each other. The programme provides a lifetime opportunity to the participants to update their knowledge, imbibe the ethos of public service and inculcate the qualities necessary for improving the citizen-centric service delivery in all aspects.

Shri Shekhar Dutt, Vice President, IIPA, spoke about the vibrant and service-oriented culture of the APPPA participants built assiduously over the years and the prestige associated with it. In his welcome address, Shri S.N. Tripathi, Director, IIPA emphasised the “minimum government and maximum governance” motto of the Government with objectives of “*Sabka saath, sabka vikas aur sabka vishwas*” and exhorted the participants to adopt these as the guiding principles of public service. Prof. Govinda Bhattacharjee, Programme Director highlighted the objectives, contents, design and methodology of the programme, while Dr. Neetu Jain, Programme Co-Director, proposed the vote of thanks.

The Programme

The programme sought to renew the participants’ domain knowledge as well as sharpen their skill sets through an integration of management concepts, tools and techniques with the requirements of public policy formulation, analysis and implementation, including the design and execution of delivery systems. The purpose was to enhance the sensibilities, sensitivities and capabilities of the participants to make and implement effective public policy systems and also to encourage exploration of innovative options and choices. Through intensive exposure to global trends and practices, APPPA encouraged exploration of innovative options and choices. As the participants are likely to work in policy formulation and service delivery at intergovernmental, national, regional or local government levels, APPPA is meant to develop their practical knowledge and skills to deal with management and policy analysis issues across the spectrum of public sector activities.

Aim

The aim of the programme is to enable the participants to develop a broad perspective and synergy to contribute towards efficient public service delivery through innovative methods in response to the people’s expectations in a dynamically changing society. It seeks to inculcate an attitude that augments efficiency and service orientation towards the citizens.

Objectives

APPPA seeks to enable the participants to:

- Understand basic concepts of the social sciences, public policy and governance;
- Crystallize their views on topical issues related to public administration and governance ethics in India;
- Analyse the factors that impact the application of policies and modalities thereon;
- Apply analytical skills in decision-making;
- Design a framework for administrative reforms and good governance; and
- Develop interpersonal skills and sensitivity towards the needs of the people.

For achieving the above objectives, the programme has been designed in such a way that there are academic- cum- training modules, experiential learning, dissertation writing and viva-voce, besides non – credit inputs for developing ethics, values, critical thinking and creativity. This year, the academic modules consisted of basic module theories and concepts; thematic modules: policy, administration and governance for insights into current themes in governance and policy domains as well as modules highlighting the critical concerns in governance besides specialised modules in the form of electives. The details are given below:

- A. Academic Modules: During the first half of the APPPA, spanning the first five months, the focus has been on theoretical underpinnings, concepts and applications. The streams have been identified on the basis of their relevance to the issues of governance and recent developments in the areas of study. These streams have further been divided into three parts:

The first sub-module A.I: *Basic Modules*: Theories and concepts covered Dynamics of Public Administration, Contemporary Governance Issues, Administrative Law, Economic Police, Trade and Globalisation, Sustainable Agriculture and Risk Management, Research Methodology and Research Methods for Social Sciences.

The second sub-module A.II: *Thematic Modules*: Policy, Administration and Governance, included Human Behaviour in Organisations, Public Finance, Public Enterprises Management, Public Policy: Global and Indian Concerns, Ethics in Governance, Gender in Development and e-Governance.

The third sub-module A.III: Critical Concerns in Governance related to Environment and Climate Change, Disaster and Sustainable Development, Indian Social System, The underprivileged and Governance, Social Justice: Equity and Harmony, Development Challenges in Tribal Areas and Aspirational Districts, Operations Management, Consumer Protection: Laws and Policies and Cyber Security and Challenges for National Security.

In the fourth sub-module A.IV, participants were offered a choice of one elective from a group of six which offered specialisation in any one area of administration, development and management. The six elective streams included: Development and Management of Infrastructure Projects, Public Health Administration, Dynamics of Indian Diaspora; Migration, Adaptation and Overseas Indian Communities and International Organisations, International Relations and International Trade, Geopolitics, National Security and Defence Strategy, Data Analysis and Interpretation using Research Software.

- B. Learning through Experience: During the programme, participants learn from each other's interesting experiences in their respective jobs as well as through visits to different places. The purpose of these visits is to expose them to the ground realities concerning the implementation and delivery of various developmental government schemes and programmes through guided study tours in selected rural and urban centres. They are also taken to the forward areas lying on the borders of the country in order to familiarise them with the security and developmental aspects in those areas. At the end, they are taken on a foreign study tour to selected

countries. The details of these during the 45th APPPA are presented as follows:

B.1 Experiential Presentations: Popular among the participants of all batches, these presentations are made by the participants about their unique and memorable experiences while dealing with problems and challenges in their respective jobs. The focus basically is on specific situations an officer has faced at some point in his/her career. These presentations highlight innovations in problem solving, in the internal administration, in evolving the best practices in organisational leadership, and in respect of project planning and implementation.

B.2 Rural Field Study: This component sensitises the participants to the socio-economic realities of rural areas. The participants are assigned a theme-based study focusing on various aspects of rural development. Small groups of participants visit identified rural areas in different parts of the country and interact with village level functionaries and Panchayat members under the overall guidance of a faculty member. They examine the effectiveness of the delivery mechanisms and try to assess the impact of rural development programmes in the assigned areas. The rural field study reports are later presented at the IIPA. This year, the villages were selected from the following states/districts:

1. Karnataka (Mysore)
2. Gujarat (Ahmedabad)
3. Meghalaya (Shillong)
4. Uttar Pradesh (Noida, Ghaziabad)

B.3 Urban Field Study: It provides an opportunity to the participants to understand the problems in urban administration and management and the challenges in addressing these. The participants study different urban developmental schemes and their impact on the socio-economic conditions of the people, including for those below the poverty line. They interact with the functionaries of Municipalities and other development agencies. The urban study reports are also presented at the IIPA after the completion of

the visits. This year, the following cities were studied by the officer trainees:

1. Delhi
2. Karnataka (Mysore)
3. Gujarat (Ahmedabad)
4. Meghalaya (Shillong)

B.4 Foreign Study Tour: In view of the outbreak of corona virus in China and its subsequent spread in other countries, the Ministry of Personnel and Training, Government of India has cancelled the foreign study visit. In fulfillment of the academic requirements of the APPPA, a group assignment on different topics was assigned to the participants, which they completed successfully.

C. Dissertation Writing & Viva – Voce

This is a major and important component of the APPPA programme. While writing the dissertation under the guidance of an expert faculty, participants make an in-depth analysis of a specific problem chosen by them including all its ramifications. Through these dissertations, they make a substantial contribution to the theory and practice of public administration while also demonstrating their analytical skills in the process. Dissertation is usually followed by a viva-voce examination of the participants. However, in view of the Covid-19 crisis and the lockdown, the viva-voce for the participants of 45th APPPA course was conducted online through video conferencing platforms. The Director IIPA and, the Programme Directors along with the faculty guide and the subject expert conducted the viva-voce online without compromising the quality.

Convocation Function

The convocation of the 45th APPPA was held on April 30, 2020 through video conferencing. The Hon'ble Union Minister of State Dr. Jitendra Singh presided over the function. Shri S N Tripathi, Director, IIPA, gave the welcome address after which Dr. C. Chandramouli, Secretary DoPT and Chairman IIPA, addressed the participants. Prof. Govinda Bhattacharjee, the Programme Director, then presented a brief report of the programme.

The convocation address was delivered by Dr. Jitendra Singh in which he highlighted the

contribution made by IIPA in public administration and governance of the country over the years. He spoke about the unprecedented challenges being faced by the government during the lockdown enforced by Covid-19 and how the Government was resolutely and successfully dealing with these challenges. In the end, Dr Neetu Jain, Co-Programme Director, proposed the vote of thanks.

Other Training Programmes

Apart from the long-term APPPA programme, the Institute organised 144 other training programmes and training workshops during 2019-20. The breakup is as follows:

LIBRARY

The following activities were carried out during the period under review.

Collection Development:

During the year 2019-20, 1106 books and 200 bound volumes of periodicals were added to the library. Out of these, 450 books were purchased, 495 were received as gratis. Around 161 documents were added to the Public Document section of which 156 were received as gratis and 05 were purchased. As on March 31, 2020 the library houses 2.26 lakh volumes of books and bound journals. The Library subscribed 114 current periodicals, 21 newspapers and received 135 periodicals on 'gratis and exchange basis' during the year.

Online Services

Subscribed Online Databases:

The Online access to over 21 periodicals including *Harvard Business Review*, *Economist*, *Time*, *Economic and Political Weekly*, etc. is being facilitated that can be reached through IIPA Library website. Besides this, the library continued subscribing to ABI/Inform, facilitating access to around 4000 titles, out of which 3000 titles are in

full text, besides the database facilitates access to about 25,000 dissertations. The Library also subscribes to the 'JSTOR' which is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to helping the scholarly community to discover, use and build upon a range of intellectual content in a trusted digital archive. It provides full-text searches of almost 2,400 journals.

- In-house Library Online Database

The computerised library database has 1.36 lakh records relating to books and reports and 1.22 records relating to periodical articles.

All these online journals and databases can be accessed 24X7 across the globe through Remotexs ssoftware.

- E-books

Library has purchased two Kindles and subscribed to Amazon unlimited Kindle online which provides access to over one million e-books which can be accessed through Kindle as well as any other device, i.e. P.C., Mobile, etc.

- Digital Knowledge Repository

Library has created Digital Knowledge Repository (DKR) showcasing the research output and published resources of the Institute. DKR plays a fundamental role in making accessible the intellectual capital, research output and published resources of the Institute. The objective is to archive and preserve the intellectual work resulting from the academic and research activity of the Institute, in order to disseminate it in the same via open access. The resources are represented in the form of communities created for various types, such as – Annual General Body Meeting, Presidential Addresses, Faculty Publications, Rare Books, E-books, Annual Reports, Special Reports, Distinguished Visitors of the Institute, Thematic Papers, Working Papers and the like. It also includes Theses and Dissertations submitted by APPPA participants for their M.Phil degree. So far 3229 documents have been uploaded in the repository including the full text top ten APPPA dissertations from 2008-09 till 2017-18.

- Binding

Around 806 periodicals and books were rebound, as part of preservation of old documents.

Library Services

As on March 31st, 2020, 1782 documents were loaned out and 1633 volume of documents were received back by the library. In addition to 9718 users comprising the Institute's Faculty, IIPA members, participants of various training programmes including the Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA), around 1348 bonafide researchers made use of the library resources under fee-based consultation programme. The Library continued to provide photocopying and internet facility to the members. During the year it made available over 40900 pages of photocopies, and provided bibliographical services to the users.

Value added services

The Library facilitates Current Awareness, Indexing and Abstracting services. The Library regularly brings out *Book Alert*: a monthly list of additions, *Article Alert*: a list of significant articles, *Weekly News Alert*, and *Current Contents*, to keep its readers informed of the incoming documents and latest information. A quarterly Indexing and Abstracting Journal titled "*Documentation in Public Administration, (DIPA)*" is being brought out by the Library. It contains indexing of periodical articles, abstracts, book reviews and book notes. During the year, 2428 Periodical Articles, 254 Book Reviews and 62 Books Notes were added to *DIPA*. All the four issues of *DIPA* for the year 2019 were brought out on time. Further the library provides bibliographical services to its members and participants of various courses on demand.

Participation in National Library Networks

The Library is an active member of the (Developing Library Network) DELNET and has been making considerable use of the network's facilities for inter-library lending, compilation of bibliographies and literature search. As part of this networking endeavour, IIPA Library is also reciprocating in use of its rich resources to other participating network members. During the year,

56 documents were borrowed on inter-library loan for the IIPA Library users and 160 documents were borrowed by other libraries through DELNET facility. As part of our reciprocal efficient services, IIPA Library has been adjudged as the best library and awarded Certificate of Appreciation by the DELNET out of 6000 libraries.

SOCIETY ACTIVITIES

SIXTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE GENERAL BODY

The 65th Annual Meeting of the General Body of the Institute was held on Friday, the 18th October, 2019 at 4.30 p.m. in the premises of the Institute. Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India and President of IIPA presided over the inaugural session and Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, Chairman IIPA and Shri Shekhar Dutt, Vice President IIPA presided over the second part of the General Body Meeting.

Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India and President of IIPA mentioned that institutions like IIPA should be knowledge hubs exchanging information and knowledge and catalysing this transformative process. IIPA has been making rapid progress over the years in this direction. It has done commendable work both in Capacity Building as well as in Research. The training, hitherto limited to the Central Government officers has now expanded to State and Foreign Governments too. He further said, "I wish to see IIPA set new ambitious goals in the next few months, benchmarking itself as one of the best institutions with similar mandate around the globe and becoming an active hub of knowledge-exchange, skill development, robust evaluation and policy advice".

Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, Chairman, IIPA in his address mentioned that IIPA has increased the major aims and objectives that were placed before it since its very inception. It is an old institution, one of the oldest so far as the field of governance is concerned and specially in respect of public services, in Government Services, Public Sector and so on. He said that it is high time and it will be a good recognition of the work that the IIPA, over the years, has done, that it is recognised as an

institute of national importance when many other institutions of this kind have got this recognition.

He hoped that regional and local branches will be in a position to revitalise themselves and contribute to the total working of the IIPA. He further mentioned that the Government has a policy that more and more such institutions have to be self-sustaining and they cannot depend all the time on the Government assistance, and we should endeavour in this regard to the best of our ability.

In his opening remarks, Shri Surendra Nath Tripathi, Director IIPA, shared in brief, the achievements and the strengths of the Institute for which the faculty and the staff of IIPA have worked hard. He enumerated the milestones that project the public service rendered by IIPA and its determined effort to overcome challenges of resource mobilisation.

The Meeting was attended by 166 members of the Institute against the minimum quorum of 50 members. The House approved the Proceedings of Sixty-fourth Annual Meeting of the General Body held on 26th October 2018, the Annual Report and the Annual Statement of Accounts for the year 2018-2019.

SIXTY-THIRD MEMBERS' ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Sixty-third Members' Annual Conference of the Institute was held on 19th October 2019 in IIPA premises.

The theme of the conference was "Good Governance and United Nations Sustainable Development Goals". Dr C. Sheela Reddy presented the theme paper in which she highlighted the concept of Sustainable Development Goals of United Nations. In his welcome address, Shri S.N. Tripathi, Director of IIPA, highlighted the significance of the theme. Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, Chairman, IIPA presided over the inaugural session of the conference. Shri Shekhar Dutt, Vice President of IIPA was also present. Representatives of Regional and Local Branches expressed their views on the theme. Besides the discussion, papers on the theme were presented during the conference.

The Conference was attended by 156 members. Prior to holding of the Annual Conference, prelude Conferences/Seminars on the Conference Theme were organised by IIPA's Regional/Local Branches at their respective headquarters. The recommendations and observations of the Conferences/Seminars held at Regional/Local Branches were presented at the Conference.

This year, Vikas Bharti Bishunpur, a voluntary social organisation, working in the area of public services in district Gumla, Jharkhand has been chosen for the Award.

REGIONAL AND LOCAL BRANCHES AND MEMBERS' ACTIVITIES

As on 31st March 2020, the total number of Regional and Local Branches of the Institute stands at 24 and 43 respectively. A sum of Rs.952082/- was paid to the Branches during the year as financial assistance including the fifty percent of share of interest earned on Life Membership Capital Fund for carrying out their programmes and activities. The Institute provides financial assistance of Rs.30,000/- to a Regional Branch and Rs.15,000/- to a Local Branch during a financial year for organising seminar/conference, Prelude seminar, etc. subject to the Branch (a) conducting regular elections, (b) submitting its audited statement of accounts regularly, and (c) submitting a report on its activities. Besides this, fifty percent share of interest and fifty percent share of annual membership subscription is also paid to the branches. A statement showing details of financial assistance given to Branches during the year 2019-2020 is given in Annexure F-6.

The Annual General Body meeting and Members' Annual Conference for which Theme paper is sent to all branches, as well as publication of the IIPA Newsletter are also member-oriented activities.

Sane, University of Madras, Chennai for her entry on "One Nation One Election: and (ii) Shri Kewal Krishan Sethi, New Delhi for his Hindi Essay "जल रक्षक" and Third Prize of Rs. 5,000/- was won by Shri Ajay Pal Singh, Chhattisgarh, on "गांधीजी आज के युग में" respectively.

CASE STUDY PROGRAMME

Hon'ble Vice President of India handed out prizes to the winner of Annual Decision Making/Teaching Case Study Competition- 2019. As none of the entries merited for first and second prize, one third prize of Rs. 4000 was awarded to Shri Manish Kumar Tiwary for his entry on "Rule of Law Must ensure that Hashimapura Never Happens".

INFRASTRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENT

The IIPA is a premier Institute which has its own Hostel Complex in its campus which provides boarding and lodging to participants of the training programmes including the APPPA, its outstation members, guests, bonafide research scholars and officers of educational Institutions and Government. departments. The Hostel has 89 rooms and eight APPPA family suites. All the Hostel rooms have ACs, attached baths, toilets and cable TVs". The Hostel has been renovated with wooden panelling.

THE INSTITUTE'S FINANCES

As shown in the Receipt & Payment Accounts (Schedule A), during the year 2019-20, the Institute's income was Rs.42.86 crore, as against the expenditure of Rs.43.22 crore. Out of the total income of Rs.42.86 crore, the Institute had received Grant-in-aid Salary/General/Capital of Rs.18.00 crore from Department. of Personnel & Training, Government of India.

Thus, after adjusting the cumulative surplus of Rs.29.04 lakh brought forward from the previous year, the cumulative deficit as per Schedule A at the end of the year is Rs.7.33 lakh.

The total income from internal resources during the year was Rs.24.86 crore as against Rs.21.33 crore in the previous year. The receipts of Rs.24.86 crore mainly comprised Training Fee (Rs.20.79 crore), net income from Research assignments (Rs.1.93 crore), User Charges (Rs.1.33 crore), Sale of Publications (Rs.3.46 lakh), etc. Out of the total payments of Rs.43.22 crore, the Institute's Pay and Allowance was Rs.10.22 crore and Pension Rs.6.00 crore. The other major items of expenditure were Campus Maintenance (Rs.2.93 crore), Administrative and Miscellaneous expenses (Rs.56.67 lakh), Training Programmes (Rs.19.48 crore).

The Institute also received a Grant-in-aid (Capital) of Rs.350.00 lakh from the Government for implementation of various activities of Capital nature, against which total expenditure of Rs.350.00 lakh was incurred. The main items of expenditure were ICT activities (Rs.72.39 lakh), Library (Rs.20.42 lakh), Strengthening of Regional/ Local Branches (Rs.4.80 lakh), Infrastructure development work/Renovation work (Rs.252.39 lakh). The Institute's detailed financial position is given in the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account.

IMPORTANT EVENTS

Seminars/Conferences/Workshops/ Lectures

The Institute organised the following seminars/conferences/lectures during the year:

National Conference on Product Liability and Consumer Protection

The Centre for Consumer Studies, Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi in collaboration with the Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of India organised a National Conference on *Product Liability and Consumer Protection* on April 2, 2019. The aim of the conference was to enable better understanding

of the law on product liability and its application in resolution of consumer grievances. More than 120 participants attended the conference. Shri Avinash Kr. Srivastava, Secretary (CA), Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of India inaugurated the workshop and Ms. Gowree Gokhale, Solicitor & Patent & TM Attorney, Nishith Desai Associates presented the keynote address. The conference was coordinated by Prof. Suresh Misra and Dr. Sapna Chadah.

Consultation Programme on Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's Thoughts

Dr. Ambedkar Chair in Social Justice, Indian Institute of Public Administration in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, Ram Lal Anand College, University of Delhi organised a day- long consultation on the theme - *Dr. B.R Ambedkar's Thoughts on Socio- Economic Transformation* in the amphitheatre of the college on April 9, 2019. As a part of the event, poster making and creative writing competitions were organised on the theme, 'Revisiting Ambedkar'. Prof. Sushma Yadhav, Vice-Chancellor, Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, Sonapat; Member, University Grants Commission and Press Council of India; Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Chair Professor, Dr. Ambedkar Chair in Social Justice, Indian Institute of Public Administration and Prof. Rakesh Kumar Gupta, Principal, Ramlal Anand College, were the main speakers during the event.

Workshop on Gender Equality at Workplace

One-day workshop on *Gender Equality at Workplace* was organised on June 7, 2019. It was sponsored by the Department of Public Enterprises, Government of India. Dr. Neetu Jain and Dr. Amit Kumar Singh coordinated the programme.

Workshop on Consumer Protection and Empowerment

A two-day workshop on "*Consumer Protection and Empowerment of Panchayati Raj Institutions, Rural Development Officials and Service Providers*" was organised by the Centre for Consumer Studies, IIPA from July 5-6, 2019 at Hapur in collaboration with the regional training

centre, Ghaziabad of State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD) Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. The programme was sponsored by the Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of India. The objective of the programme was to build capacity of the people working at grassroots level about consumer rights and Consumer Protection Act. The programme was inaugurated by Ms. Babita Singh, Block *Pramukh*, Block Panchayat, Hapur. It was coordinated by Prof. Suresh Misra and Dr. Sapna Chadah.

Workshop for Officers of Fertilizers Department

A customised workshop for officers of the Department of Fertilizers, Government of India was organised on July 13, 2019 which was attended by a cross section of officers of the Department, right from the level of Fertilizers Secretary, Shri Chhabilendra Roul to Section Officers. The purpose of the workshop was to enhance the sensibilities, sensitivities and capabilities of officers to accomplish improved quality of output. Prof. Ashok Vishandass and Dr. Surabhi Pandey coordinated the workshop.

Special lecture- Paradise Regained: A Review of the Impact of the Big Decision

Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) has started Special Lecture Series on current and relevant themes with First Lecture on "Paradise Regained: A Review of the Impact of the Big Decision" by Lt Gen Syed Ata Hasnain organised on August 26, 2019. The lecture was presided over by Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, Former Governor of Karnataka & Kerala and Chairman, IIPA. Speaking on the theme, Lt Gen Hasnain said that the general perception in Indian public's mind was that the abrogation of Articles 35A and 370 had led to a situation where the J&K issue is done and dusted. That is farthest from the truth although it is currently advantageous to India, at least temporarily. Shri T.N. Chaturvedi, Chairman IIPA in his presidential remarks said that the Government of India was aware of the fact that the stalemate existed in J&K due to the absence of strategic policy. Besides stabilising the situation in J&K, a long-term strategy is also required. Shri SN Tripathi, Director, IIPA, in his welcome address, dwelt upon the need for the Special lecture series and how it

was necessary for the participants as well as for the Institute. The lecture was coordinated by Dr Sapna Chadah. Shri Amitabh Ranjan, Registrar IIPA presented the Vote of Thanks.

Special Lecture on National Education Policy: Principles and Priorities

Second in the series, IIPA organised a special lecture on *National Education Policy: Principles and Priorities* on September 6, 2019. Shri Anil Swarup, Former Secretary, School Education and Literacy delivered the lecture. He presented an over view and current status of the primary education sector and emphasised on the achievements of the policy. The session was presided over by Shri S.N.Tripathi, Director, IIPA, and coordinated by Dr. Roma Debnath.

Special Lecture on Doubling of Farmers' Income

Third in the series, IIPA organised a special lecture on Doubling of Farmers' Income on September 30, 2019. The lecture was delivered by Shri Ashok Dalwai, Chairman, National Rainfed Area Authority, New Delhi. Shri S. N. Tripathi, Director, IIPA, presided over the lecture. Centre for Climate Change, Environment and Drought Administration

On-going Research Projects

1. Climate Smart Governance sponsored by Department of Science & Technology, Government of India.
2. Capacity Building Strategies for Managing Complex Disasters in the face of Climate Change sponsored by National Mission on Himalayan Studies (NMHS) & Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC)
3. Assessment of capacities and training needs of key stakeholders for long-term effective biodiversity conservation, development and implementation of a capacity building framework to enhance capacities of key stakeholders in SECURE Himalayan Project Landscapes in districts of Sikkim sponsored by UNDP.
4. Third party Evaluation of Other Disaster Management Schemes (ODMS) sponsored by NDMA.

Assessing and enhancing the capacities for biodiversity conservation sponsored by UNDP

Sikkim is known for its rich and diverse flora and fauna supported by unique climate created by topography of Himalayas. Over the years Sikkim has seen an increase in the number of tourists along with speedy infrastructural development. Growing urban population combined with industrial development also pose a serious challenge to the environment, jeopardizing the biodiversity richness of Sikkim. Since, Sikkim's biodiversity facilitates in increasing tourism and ultimately stands as a strong pillar for state's economy. It is, therefore, important to focus on its conservation and capacity development of key stakeholders. The process of capacity development required identifying what key capacities already exist and what additional capacities may be needed in the system.

Indian Institute of Public Administration,

New Delhi has been entrusted with one such assignment "Assessment of capacities and training needs of key stakeholders for long-term effective biodiversity conservation, development and implementation of a capacity building framework to enhance capacities of key stakeholders in SECURE Himalayan Project landscapes in districts of Sikkim" sponsored by UNDP. The landscape includes Khangchendzonga National Park and Singba Rhododendron Sanctuary as Protected Areas and also the Tso-Lhamu Plateau in the northern Trans-Himalayan zone as a proposed conservation area. The study focuses to assess the capacities and training needs of key stakeholders for long-term biodiversity conservation, livelihood enhancement and natural resource management and also to develop a framework and strategies for capacity development of the target stakeholders. For capacity development framework, identifying key stakeholders is very crucial. So, the first step of the whole process is to identify and prioritise the relevant stakeholders. And the next step was to conduct detailed "Training Needs Analysis" for determining if a training need exists and if it does, what training is required to fill the gap. This facilitated in identifying accurately the levels of the present situation in the target groups.

The project team assesses the capacity and training needs of government agencies and community institutions and other relevant key stakeholders involved in natural resource management for sustainability of the biodiversity resources using landscape-based approach. This involves literature review, surveys using questionnaires, brainstorming with stakeholders, community interaction and interviews all under experts' guidance.

Based on the analysis and consultation workshops with stakeholders three modules were developed in lieu of grassroots level requirement, showcasing practical and region-specific information with quantitative figures. These includes: General module to provide an overview of the importance of biodiversity conservation goals; Module I Agriculture and Biodiversity which would facilitate in implementing agro-biodiversity agenda in the state; and Module II Sustainable Tourism to strengthen tourism sector to minimise ecological impacts and maintaining the sustainability.

This comprehensive assessment yields a complete view of the present scenario in line with biodiversity conservation in the state. This would facilitate the authorities to focus more on weaker sections or on areas which require more capacities. Moreover, this will facilitate in mainstreaming biodiversity concerns in development planning involving concerned stakeholders. Some sectors are doing excellent while some need to expand little more in terms of existing capacities which has been recommended through this study. The major outcomes of the project, i.e scorecard and modules are being disseminated to wider audience for holistic approach in capacity development.

CLIMATE SMART GOVERNANCE (2019-2020)

Two- Week Faculty Development Programme

The “Two-Week Faculty Development Programme on Climate Smart Governance” in collaboration with Gujarat Institute of Disaster Management (GIDM) was conducted from 17th to 28th June, 2019. The target audience for the same was university faculty, research scholars from various parts of the country, which are already engaged in subjects related to climate change and have the pre-requisite knowledge about the same. This programme helped in honing their skills and knowledge further. Faculty from different fields, viz., geography, political science, soil conservation, forestry, botany, environmental engineering, participated in the capacity-building programme. Total twenty-three participants have successfully completed the training programme.

Blended Capacity Building Programme: Senior Level Officers

Blended Capacity Building Programme for senior level officers was conducted from 26th September to 04th October, 2019. This programme was successfully executed in association with Gujarat Institute of Disaster Management, Gandhinagar, Gujarat. The programme was designed for the senior level officers of different state departments of Gujarat. Officers from different departments, viz., Water Resources Department, Road and Transport Department,

Energy Department, Municipal Corporation, etc., actively participated and appreciated the concept of blended learning.

CAPACITY BUILDING STRATEGIES FOR MANAGING COMPLEX DISASTERS IN THE FACE OF CLIMATE CHANGE (2019-20)

Capacity Building Programme for the PRI Members and the Local Community

The training workshop was conducted on 6th and 9th May, 2019 in the districts’ of North and West of Sikkim. The training workshop, Capacity Building was directed at the local residents of the selected GPUs, their panchayat members and the school students alike. The GPUs for which the Capacity Building Workshop was conducted have already been subjected to the Community Risk Registers and the programme focused on the issues highlighted by the community for their own respective GPUs. The focus of the Training in these GPUs was complex disaster caused by climate change. The community should be aware of the effects of Climate Change in context of Sikkim and their own area.

INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR - Challenges on Disaster Risk Reduction of Hill Cities

Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) along with Sikkim State Disaster Management Authority (SSDMA), Land Revenue and Disaster Management Department conducted a two-day seminar on 18th and 19th September, 2019. This event was organised in collaboration with Sikkim State Disaster Management Authority (SSDMA) under the project, ‘Capacity Building Strategies for Managing Complex Disasters in the face of Climate Change’ sponsored by the National Mission on Himalayan Studies and Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change.

Painting Competition

A painting competition for students from ten senior secondary schools from the Soreng, Chumbung, Tharpu, Pakkigaon, Sombaria, Sribadam, Timburbung, Gelling, Chakung and Daramdin was organised on the first day of the event, 5th March. The theme of the painting competition was ‘Sikkim: Treading towards Climate Smart and Disaster Resilient State’. Fifty students from these ten schools participated in the competition. Ashis Mukhiya from K. B. Limboo Memorial Senior Secondary School, Sribadam stood first, while Manjila Biswa from Gelling Senior Secondary School and Kailash Pradhan from Tharpu Senior Secondary School stood second and third in the competition respectively.

Launching of Sunny Weather Lab

Sunny Weather Lab; a school-based weather station was launched during this two-day event. The Government Senior Secondary School Soreng was equipped with six instruments to measure the minimum and maximum temperature daily, rainfall, humidity, atmospheric pressure, wind speed and wind direction. The Weather Lab is expected to sensitise the students towards the climate change and ignite their curiosity to study the phenomena further. In this session, an official handling of Sunny Weather Lab from students and teachers of Soreng Senior Secondary School to students and teachers of Junior High School, Upper Shyari was done.

Mr. Kunga Nima Lepcha, Hon'ble Minister for Sports & Youth Affairs Department, Education Department, Land Revenue & Disaster Management Department & Law Department Government of Sikkim, was the chief guest of the event. In his address he expressed his

gratitude for organising the two- day event on disaster preparedness. He appreciated zeal and enthusiasm of the children who had participated in the event. He encouraged the students to bring the change needed to protect the environment. He emphasised upon the importance of following the safety standards for the buildings for the disaster preparedness. He also elaborated on how the state government was working to ensure that the state remains prepared to face the natural calamities at any hour. He reiterated the resolve of the government to become climate smart and climate resilient state.

Third Party Evaluation of Other Disaster Management Schemes (ODMS)

Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) has been entrusted to conduct Third Party Evaluation of the 34 Other Disaster Management Schemes (ODMS). ODMS has 49 schemes of NDMA; 03 sub-schemes of NIDM, NDRF and 02 sub schemes of Disaster Management division, i.e. National Disaster Management Programme (NDMP) and UNDP for Disaster Risk Management out of which 34 schemes are proposed to be extended beyond March 2020.

The study aims to provide roadmap for enhancing the effectiveness of the schemes and to meet its proposed mandate in an efficient manner. It would help in documenting the impact of the extension activities and programmes being conducted and the extent of coordination among stakeholders to assess the requirements and priorities for the schemes.

These schemes will be evaluated as per the performance based on intended scope of work and objectives achieved so far. This study will provide insights on the status, and gaps/ challenges of the projects, whether or not they have achieved their targets.

ACTIVITIES OF THE CENTRE (2019-2020)

1. About Tribal Talent Pool

Tribal Talent Pool is a scheme of MoTA which aims at development of the Tribal scholars by providing an environment of learning, support, contribution and recognition of the tribals. MoTA has entrusted Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi, being one of the Centre of Excellence (CoE), with the task to assess and strengthen training needs and capacity building of such scholars and select 500 most talented scholars from the Tribal Talent Pool of Doctoral fellow. For this purpose, IIPA will conduct various programmes to improve the quality of research so as to enable the Doctoral scholars to participate in various research and evaluation activities undertaken by MoTA at Central and state levels. The programme will also identify scholars for their entrepreneurial skills and capacity. The selected students will also be given option to act as a mentor for the upcoming tribal students who have interest in research activities. IIPA will also develop Alumni for such talent.

Activity:

IIPA organised a series of workshops in Delhi and at Regional headquarters after discussion with the nodal Universities/Institutes.

- (i) Assessment and Strengthening Training for tribal talent pool, sponsored by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India from 3rd to 5th December, 2019.
- (ii) Workshop on “Heritage & Sustainability of the Tribals” at Sikkim in collaboration with Kaziranga University from 28th December 2019 to 1st January 2020.
- (iii) Tribal Intellectuals and Inclusion, which is sponsored by Ministry of Tribal Affairs,

Government of India from 28th & 29th February, 2020 at Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences, Bhubaneswar.

2. About Capacity Building and Strengthening of Tribal Research Institutes:

Tribal research institutes are the major backbone for mainstreaming the tribes. They act as the first responder to any need to the tribal groups in the region. Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs) are envisaged to work as body of knowledge and research and as a think tank for tribal development, preservation of tribal cultural heritage, providing inputs to states for evidence-based planning and appropriate legislations, capacity building of tribals and persons / institutions associated with tribal affairs, dissemination of information and creation of awareness, etc. These Institutes are engaged in the work of providing planning inputs to the state governments, conducting research and evaluation studies, collection of data, identify challenges in the field of socio-economic development of tribals and understanding, promoting and preserving their culture. Training and capacity building of stakeholders, and knowledge advocacy that would help formulate evidence-based policy and planning are also the thrust areas for providing assistance under the scheme. Training is an integral component of all such programmes. Ministry of Tribal affairs is funding TRIs under the scheme “Support to TRIs”, for conducting research. During deliberations it has been observed that TRIs do not have a uniform approach in identification of research projects, training programmes, areas of research project, methodology and monitoring of research. One of the examples is Forest Right Act, where different TRIs have developed different forms and portals for collecting data and devising training mechanisms. It is also felt that some of the TRIs who are doing well need to mentor new TRIs. Some TRIs have also brought out various problems regarding scope of work, staff strength, availability of funds and administrative setup. There is a need to develop a standardised training process and module for the TRIs and there is a need to reinvent the modes of action.

Activity:

A National Consultation on “Capacity Building

and Strengthening of Tribal Research Institutes was organised by CoE, Tribal Affairs in which all the heads of TRIs from across the country had participated on 28 – 29th January, 2020 at Indian Institute of Public Administration.

This case study aims to evaluate the digital engagement of citizens for policy formulation, with special reference to India's MyGov' and is being written at the behest of The Chancellors Masters and Scholars of University, Oxford University, UK.

It had aimed to understand if the establishment of citizen engagement digital platforms in developing countries such as MyGov (India), have been able to achieve a meaningful outcome for policy formulation on governance issues. The fifty-seven paged study had relied on multiple data gathering techniques including semi-formal interviews with owner and designer of the platform, web -site observation and reference of secondary material including government reports and academic publications. It focuses on various aspects including the non-availability of a regular feedback loop between the government, MyGov and the citizens, the net outcome of the entire consultation process is not as encouraging as it could have been. The governments must, therefore focus on creating systemic changes to be able to use digital technologies more prudently to achieve SDGs in a truly citizen-inclusive manner.

ACTIVITIES OF CENTRE FOR URBAN STUDIES

(April 2019-March 2020)

CUS during the year 2019-20, further diversified and extended its outreach and coverage through a typology of research, capacity building & advisory service. It is building capacities of urban sector institutions belonging to centre, states and cities and also extending/sharing urban agenda of Govt of India to a range of Govt departments/agencies and officers from programmes under bilateral/ multilateral cooperation.

MoU have been signed to expedite training on Government of India's urban missions with Govt. of Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Mizoram and revised MoU, as per instruction of Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, were also signed with Govt. of NCT of Delhi and Arunachal Pradesh. MoU was also signed with IIT Roorkee for professional cooperation and exchange of experience.

TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING ACTIVITIES

During the year, Centre conducted 33 events covering 1058 participants. These events include Six Workshop/Seminars/Conferences/ Panel Discussion, Fourteen Customised Training Programmes on Urban Development and related issues and Design, Development & Delivery of Urban Module for Thirteen midcareer/career enhancement programmes for Government Officers from All India/Central and Defence Services and Govt. departments and agencies. These programmes also include a fairly diversified contents covering urban governance, finance, poverty alleviation, housing, environment and productivity.

Workshop, Seminars, Conferences and Panel Discussions

CUS has been conducting Workshop, Seminars, Conferences and Panel Discussions on Urban Development and other related issues. CUS has also been conducting International Conferences along with other institutions as knowledge partner. Two Seminars, One International Conference, Panel Discussions and Workshops has been organised. The list of

conducted workshop/seminars/ conferences/panel discussion is given in Table-1.

Customised Training Programmes on Urban Development and related issues

Fourteen Customised Training Programmes on Urban Development and related issues have been conducted till February, 2020. The participants in respective programmes include officers from ULBs and MoHUA & its agencies (CPWD, NBCC and HUDCO), CPCB (Central Pollution Control Board and Cantonment Board/ MES) and officers from states (Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar and NCTD).

CUS has also conducted a one-week special programme on urban development and four urban exposure visit for government functionaries from All India Services, Central Services and Defence Services. The list of customised training programme is given in Table-2.

Design, Development & Delivery of Urban Module in the Mid-career Programmes for Government Officers

Design Development & Delivery of Urban Module for midcareer/career enhancement programmes for Government Officers (All India/Central and Defence Services and Govt. departments and agencies) in thirteen IIPA's programmes till February, 2020. The list of workshop/seminars/conferences/panel discussion is given in Table-3.

RESEARCH AND ADVISORY SERVICES

Research and advisory services on contemporary urban issues include handholding of select states, specific assignments as suggested MoHUA and professional activities for urban sector stakeholders.

Research

CUS has submitted final report of its two research studies namely (i) *Manpower Assessment of Six (HR, Public Health, Civil Engineering,*

Horticulture, Education and Electricity Departments of NDMC and (ii) Third Party Audit (Process audit on Governance system) of eight hospitals (Govt. of NCTD in line with the order of Hon'ble High Court of Delhi). Documentation of Best Practices on Solid Waste Management is under finalization. In addition, Four City study reports have also been prepared. These explain urban study visits to Mysore and adjoining towns, Ahmedabad, Delhi and Shillong.

Technical proposals have been prepared and submitted to ministries, states and other urban institutions, which are under negotiation. These are as follow:

1. Technical proposals for studies/academic activities submitted to (i) State Government of Bihar, Arunachal Pradesh, Lucknow, Mizoram etc. for MoU under ICB programme, (ii) Social Impact Assessment (SIA) Govt. of NCTD etc.
2. Proposal for Foreign Study Visit under Smart City Mission submitted to Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Govt. of India.
3. Proposal for Foreign Study Visit for Officers of Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh.
4. Proposal for Study on Frame-work for ULB Role in NCAP (National Clean Air Programme)
5. Two Study Proposal submitted to National Mission for Clean Ganga, Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India.
6. Proposal submitted for UN-Habitat Capacity Building Programme for City Leaders in Ethiopia.
7. Study on Costing & Pricing and Cost Recovery for Urban Water Supply in Uttar Pradesh.

- (a) Faculty members have been given recognition by agencies and institutions/commissions of high repute set up by NCR Planning Board, Govt. of NCTD, ITPI (Institute Town and Planning of India), AMDA (Association of Municipalities and Development Authorities) and Editorial Board of reputed journals such as Nagarlok, Asian Review of Public Administration and AKANKSHA - YSSG Magazine etc.
- (b) Faculty members widely published papers in the News Papers, Periodicals, Books etc.
- (c) In addition, CUS faculty also provided faculty inputs to the courses conducted by Haryana Institute of Public Administration, Human Settlement Management Institute (HSMI), Schools of Planning & Architecture, Institute of Town Planners of India and Association of Municipalities and Development Authorities. These programmes provided an opportunity to teach and learn for further dissemination.

The Knowledge Resource Management Portal works in close coordination with various state governments and other stakeholders. While consumer helplines are working in 26 States, consumer helplines of 13 States are using the common IT platform for registering the calls and using knowledge database. Currently 13 States are now on board with IIPA using centralized IT platform and knowledge database.

Summary

The State Consumer Helplines are normally receiving complaints from the consumers through telephone - toll free number. Besides this consumers are also approaching SCHs through other modes of communications like letters, emails, walk-in consumers, and also lodging their complaints directly on the website using online complaint registration. The State Consumer Helplines are functioning in the States to advise and assist in their state specific local language in addition to English and Hindi. The statistical is given below:

➤ Snapshot of Complaints

- 68530 calls have been received from consumers from 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020.
- Maximum numbers of calls were received at the State helplines in the states- Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Telangana, Gujarat, Haryana, West Bengal, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Uttar

Pradesh and Puducherry.

- Madhya Pradesh tops the tally with 13072 calls registered from 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020.
- The helplines functioning in the States are being persuaded to collect database of the local service providers to facilitate state helplines in redressal of the consumer grievances.

➤ Complaints

- The State of Haryana and Rajasthan have reported that 94% and 88% of the complaint has been resolved respectively. While the State of Telangana and Maharashtra has resolved 78% and 63% of the consumer complaints.
- Madhya Pradesh tops the tally with 98% Complaints Resolved from 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of Indian Institute of Public Administration

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Indian Institute of Public Administration ("IIPA"), which comprise the balance sheet as at March 31st 2020, and Statement of Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended, receipts and payment, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the aforesaid financial statements give the information the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the institute as at March 31, 2020, and statement of Income & Expenditure and Receipt and Payments for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

Basis for Qualified Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the entity in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by ICAI and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

We report that,

a) Fixed Assets

Management is in the process of conducting physical verification of the assets, and discrepancies of Rs 114 lakhs, as reported in previous year also, between gross value of fixed assets and assets physically verified in the previous year needs to be reconciled.

However, pending final reconciliation of the finding of the physically verifier team, effect of the same has not been considered in the financial statements. We have been informed that a committee has been constituted to address this issue.

b) Service Tax

IIPA has been requesting the government for waiver of Service tax, being an education institution. However, IIPA has implemented Service tax w.e.f. 1st April 2016, in absence of any response. As explained to us, compliances of service tax prior to 1st April 2016 will be addressed once a response is received. Expert opinion with respect to applicability of service tax prior to 01-04-2016 should be taken.

c) Goods and Service Tax

- a. We observed that monthly GST returns are not filed on time. GST Annual Return of 17-18 is yet to be filed.

- b. Monthly GSTR 1 is yet to be filed for the FY 2018-19 and 2019-20. We suggest that system of raising invoices should be centralised to facilitate details of invoice raised in GSTR 1.
- c. GST matters needs to be reviewed, particularly on the input credit adjustable against provision of service. We are unable to comment on the impact thereof if any.

d) Tax Deducted at source

IIPA has not accounted for TDS on accrual basis. It was observed that TDS liability on expenses payable of Rs 18,405 has not been raised. As explained to us, Liability of TDS will be settled at the time of payment of expenses.

- e) Utilisation certificates are being provided by the finance department are based upon statement approved by Project Heads.

Further attention is drawn on

- Current Liability includes amount of Rs 63.73 lakhs which is received from training programs and Projects but not accounted as income so far due to absence of information, In our opinion, effort should be made to reconcile the same at the earliest.
- Balance of Rs 51.55 lakhs is recoverable from training program is treated as recoverable by the management. In our opinion, efforts should be made to recover the same at earliest.
- Current liability includes amount of Rs 2.18 Lakhs being donation received from IIPA members not transferred to income due to pending approvals. Refer Schedule 13, Point B (V).
- **Rent Receivable from NIDM (20%)**
- There is an outstanding receivable of 2.17 Crores from Last 4 Years. Efforts should be made to recover the same at the earliest.
- Fixed Assets register are as per GFR Provisions. It should be updated regularly.
- **Accounting Treatment of Fixed Assets acquired out of Grant**
- Presently, Fixed Assets acquired out of grant are capitalised with corresponding credit in Assets fund. In our opinion, value of assets acquired out of grant should be reduced from gross cost of the assets. However, pending final review of the findings of the assets, no effect of the same has been considered by the management.
- There is a huge long term liability (inclusive of retirement benefits like pension, gratuity etc) to the tune of Rs. 109.87 Crores. This huge liability is a cause for concern and IIPA should look into ways and means to address this issue.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the entity in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Report on other legal and regulatory requirement

We report that:

- i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the institute, so far as appears from our examination of those books.

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes forming part of the Accounts.

1. Background

Indian Institute of Public Administration, established as an autonomous body under the Registration of Societies Act, was inaugurated on March 29, 1954 by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru who was the first President of the Society. The basic purpose of establishing this Institute was to undertake such academic activities as would enhance the leadership qualities and managerial capabilities of the executives in the government and other public service organizations.

2. Method of Accounting

Financial Statement of the Institute has been prepared on “Accrual Basis” which is in accordance with the generally accepted Accounting Principles. Financial Statements are prepared in respect of transaction at Delhi office. The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention unless otherwise stated.

a) Fixed Assets

- Till 31st March 2012, assets acquired out of own sources were charged to Profit and Loss Account with a corresponding entry in Assets Fund Account in Balance Sheet. However, at the time of conversion of the accounting system from Cash to Accrual in 2012-13, assets acquired from own source has been treated as Capital item and capitalised under the Fixed Assets. Cut-off date for capitalisation has been taken as 5 year i.e. assets acquired from own source from 1st April 2008 has been capitalised. Value of Land and Building and Books has been captured from the financial records as at 31st March 2013.
- Assets created out of grant received funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute, are treated as a Fixed Assets of the Institute with a corresponding credit to Asset Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on such assets which are acquired out of funds.
 - a) Grants-in-Aid
 - Maintenance Grant received for recurring expenditure is treated as income as and when received.
 - Grants-in-aid for Capital Expenditure e.g. Fixed Assets are transferred to Capital Fund.
 - Grant in aid for Specified assignment is utilised for the purpose for which such grants received and unutilised grants are carried forward and exhibited as a Liability in the Balance Sheet. In case, expenditure is more than the grant received, then the same is exhibited as Grant Receivable.
 - Surplus/ deficit on the research projects / assignments is accounted for in Income and Expenditure account on the completion of the research projects/ assignments.
 - b) In respect of ongoing Sponsored Projects, Research Projects and Programme, expenditure of such project are debited to such specified project. Overhead charges recovered from the projects are treated as income of the Institute.
 - c) Life /Corporate Membership Fee received is not treated as income and instead transferred to specific funds i.e. Life /Corporate Membership Capital Fund.

- d) Interest received on investments made against Life /Corporate Membership Capital Fund is transferred to the respective funds and are not treated as income whereas 50% of the interest received on general funds is transferred to income and balance 50% is shown as payable to branches.
- e) Income on Interest bearing advances to staff for House Building and other advances are accounted for on accrual basis, though the actual recovery of interest starts after the full repayment of the Principal.
- f) Income and expenditure relating to capital fund are credited / debited to respective capital fund.
- g) Assets created out of grants received, funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute, are treated as a Fixed Assets of the Institute with a credit to Capital Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on such assets which are acquired out of funds.
- h) No provision for Income Tax has been considered in view of the tax exemption certificate received from Director General of Income Tax dated 20th Dec 2010
- i) The foreign Currency transactions are translated at the rate prevailing on the date of transactions. However, year-end monetary transactions are stated at the year-end rate.
- j) Income and expenditure from various activities has been accounted for on accrual basis, except for
 - Membership Fee receipt, which is accounted for as and when received.
 - Receipt from Room Hostel is accounted for on Cash Basis.
 - Expenditure on Leave Travel Concession has been accounted for on Cash Basis.
 - Financial Assistance given to branches is treated as expenditure in the year of payment.
 - Sale of Admission form is accounted for on Cash Basis.
 - Royalty received on sale of Publications.

3. Fixed Assets

- Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition (inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes, and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition) less accumulated depreciation.
- Assets created out of Grants received, funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute are treated as a Fixed Assets of the Institute with a credit to Capital Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on such assets which are acquired out of funds.

4. Depreciation on Fixed Assets

- Depreciation on other than assets acquired out of the grants received/sponsored fund, has been charged under written down method at the rates specified in Income Tax Act i.e.

- Vehicle	15%
- Office Equipment	15%
- Computer	40%
- Furniture	10%
- Depreciation is charged @ 50% of the applicable rate in case of assets acquired after 30th September
- Assets costing less than Rs.5000/- are depreciated fully in the year of acquisition.

B) Notes to Accounts

- i) Physical verification of the Fixed Assets has been conducted by the committee constituted by the Institute. However, finding of the committee is under review. Effect of the discrepancies i.e. Shortages in the Gross Value of Fixed Assets to the tune of Rs 114 Lakh, as pointed out by the Committee, shall be accounted for at the time of final review. For the purpose of the Financial Statement, book balance of the fixed assets has been considered under Fixed Assets. Updation of the fixed assets register is also in progress.
- ii) No provision has been created for the service tax liability and further no consultancy for the same has been taken.
- iii) Advances for expenses given to staff are subject to confirmation. For the purpose of financial statement, amount recoverable as per financial books has been treated as receivable. Obtaining of the balance confirmation from the staff members / faculty members is in the process.
- iv) TDS has been deducted at the time of payment.
- v) Current liabilities include Rs. 218313/- being donation received from IIPA members, the same will be transferred to income account after necessary approvals.
- vi) Previous year's figures have been re-grouped, re-cast and re-arranged wherever necessary.
