I am delighted to write this message for the 67-year old prestigious publication of IIPA, its Annual Report, which is a summarized version of the year-long activities of the Institute in 2020-21.

In 2020-21, COVID-19 hit the world and there was crisis everywhere due to pandemic. However, it goes to the credit of IIPA that it quickly transformed itself into Digital Training, prepared digital infrastructure as well as digital contents even at the height of Corona and the lockdown. During the pandemic, IIPA conducted maximum number of research projects

for different Ministries and departments of Government of India, in keeping with the Mantra of "Minimum Attendance Maximum Output", IIPA Faculty and officers worked tirelessly from Home, to deliver much more than the expected output.

Under the guidance and direction of the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the Government has launched Mission Karmayogi (National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building) with the objective to bring complete transformation in the capacity building of the civil services. We are moving from a Rule-based system to a Role-based system. IIPA has established a Mission-Karmayogi Resource Cell at IIPA. IIPA is now a leading Institution in the field of Digital Training which has uploaded a sizeable number of courses on iGOT platform. In addition, IIPA has been preparing Courses for its own LMS for future Online Training Programs.

The General Body of IIPA, in its Annual Meeting held on 31st October, 2020, approved wide-ranging amendments to IIPA Memorandum of Association and Rules to make IIPA Executive Council leaner, effective, efficient and more representative. These were necessary in view of the changing times, making the Governing Body more efficient.

One of the first decisions at the meeting attended by me after taking over as the Chairman IIPA EC, was to re-open the Life Membership of IIPA w.e.f. 1st January, 2021 after a long moratorium. 1 am pleased to know that IIPA has now launched a membership drive and has been trying to enrol serving Civil Servants as well as Academicians as its Life Members. This will, no doubt, help disseminate the knowledge and best practices of Public Administration across all the stakeholders. The effort will also be to seek greater integration and De-Silosation.

I compliment the Team IIPA for their efforts in upholding the spirit of the institution.

### FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

2020-21 has been historic for IIPA in many ways. The Hon'ble Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science & Technology, Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievance and Pensions was requested to take over as the ex-Officio Chairman of IIPA Executive Council in the capacity of the Hon'ble Minister of State in charge of DoPT. The Hon'ble Union Minister had been kind enough to accept the responsibility as the ex-Officio Chairman of the IIPA Executive Council.

2020-21 had been an eventful year during which, the General Body of IIPA in its Annual Meeting held on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2020 approved wide-ranging amendments to IIPA Memorandum of Association and Rules to make IIPA Executive Council leaner, effective, efficient and more representative. The amendments have been implemented since then.

After the implementation of the amendments, IIPA opened its Life Membership also w.e.f. 1st January 2021 after a long moratorium in view of several requests from Regional and Local Branches and aspiring Members. Since then, IIPA has scrutinized all the pending applications and granted membership to eligible applicants. IIPA has also launched the membership drive and invited applications from all Regional and Local branches.

The year 2020-21 will also be remembered not only in IIPA but in India and the whole world due to the alarming spread of the Covid-19 pandemic. It was crisis everywhere due to this deadly pandemic and subsequent lockdowns. The activities at IIPA also got badly affected as physical trainings came to a grinding halt, normal operations paralyzed and resource generation dried up. However, IIPA did not lose its spirit and in fact, the academic activities of the Institute intensified since May 2020. IIPA found a new ally in the form of Digital Trainings.

For online training programmes, IIPA quickly transformed itself to adopt the digital tools and techniques. IIPA has established several VC and digitally equipped Classrooms for online training as well as prepared digital training modules and courses. In Financial Year 2020-21, IIPA conducted 66 online training programmes for Indian as well as foreign Government officers from various countries like Vietnam, Cambodia, Bhutan, Argentina, Kingdom of Eswatini (formerly Swaziland), Costa Rica, Kenya, Mauritius, etc. under Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme (ITEC), *Ministry of External Affairs*.

In a first kind of thing for IIPA, it has been entrusted with 'Namami Gange Programme' by National Mission for Clear Ganga (NMCG), Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India to take the lead by integrating people's participation for Ganga Rejuvenation. The major objective of the programme is to strengthen capacity and public awareness and promote multi-sectoral coordination with stakeholders' engagement. It is a 3-year long programme and IIPA has developed blended learning material for web-based training on the IIPA LMS platform. Under this project, IIPA has trained 9177 school students from more than 80 schools and created 672 master trainers in 2020-21.

In another first for IIPA, it is helping the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India in establishing and incubating National Tribal Research Institute (NTRI). The NTRI is being established at IIPA Campus in IIPA Annexe building and IIPA is mentoring NTRI.

During COVID-19 pandemic, IIPA conducted the maximum number of research projects for different ministries and departments of Government of India. IIPA Applied Research wing gained a qualitative upswing with specific governance areas of concern. IIPA faculty completed around 60 research studies for various Central Ministries and state governments. This has been a wonderful achievement in this time of global crisis.

IIPA started webinar series from May 2020 on the topics of current relevance such as Mission Karmayogi, Post Covid-19 Governance Reforms, Reforms in Agriculture, Digital Transformation of Governance in Post-Pandemic Period, National Statistical System, Strengthening Healthcare System, Ayushman Bharat, Central Public Sector Enterprises, National Security, Foreign Policies, Climate Challenges, Atal Mission for Rejuvention and Urban Transformation (AMRUT), National Heritage City Development, etc. In Financial Year 2020-21, IIPA conducted 46 webinars.

Taking a cue from the Government, IIPA quickly established a dedicated 'Mission Karmayogi Resource Centre' for coordinating all activities related to this mission mode programme with faculty and outside organizations. IIPA is collaborating with various institutions like Wadhwani Foundation, J-PAL, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, CTIs and ATIs for the development of programmes, modules, and courses for iGOT platform. FRACing (Framework of Roles, Activities and Competencies) which is an integral part of Mission Karmayogi, is also in forefront of IIPA activities.

The 46th Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) commenced on 1st July 2020 on online mode, which was inaugurated online by Hon'ble Union Minister of DoPT, Dr Jitendra Singh. It started in the middle of Covid-19 pandemic and lockdown. It was the first Mid-career programme to have successfully started on time and carried out in online mode throughout its 10-month duration.

IIPA celebrated 'Hindi Diwas' by conducting a special lecture on 16 September 2020 by Shri Sumeet Jerath, IAS, Secretary to Government of India, Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.

On knowledge dissemination front, the operationalization of Digital Repository of IIPA library, giving access to huge resources of IIPA library from remote locations, has helped IIPA spread its wings in every nook and corner of the academic world now.

The Institute conveys its gratitude to the DoPT and other Ministries at the Centre and states and to all other agencies for their support for the training, research, workshops and seminars and other activities at IIPA assisting the Government's efforts to continuously upgrade knowledge base and improve quality of delivery of public services. We place on record our gratitude and appreciation for the constant support provided by the Hon'ble Vice President of India and President IIPA, the Hon'ble Union Minster and Chairman IIPA, EC and the members of the Executive Council.

The Institute also thanks all the office-bearers of Regional and Local branches, faculty members, Officers and staff of the Institute for their sincere efforts in the overall development of the Institute. We are grateful to all those within and outside IIPA who have assisted us and contributed to the success of our activities and efforts during 2020-21 and look forward to more of the same.

### REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE INSTITUTE

# 2020-2021

### **AN OVERVIEW**

This Report ofIndian Institute of Public Administration pertains to the year 2020-2021. The Institute undertakes research studies on substantive and contemporary issues as well as in specific areas as sponsored by the governments, national organisations and international agencies. It also offers advisory services in operational areas to government and public sector enterprises. It conducts a large number of training programmes on various aspects and facets of the study and practice of public administration and management and trains about 5000 officers and civil society members every year from India and abroad. It also publishes and disseminates literature on public administration through special publications and iournals.

The Report presents the activities of the Institute under the following four major heads:

- Training
- Research Activities
- Information Management
- Associational and Outreach Activities.

The Report includes information about the:

- Institute's Finances
- Academic Events like Seminars, Conferences, Lectures, Visits, Book Releases, etc.
- Activity Reports of various Committees and Centres of IIPA
- · Academic Activities of Faculty
- Administrative and Personnel Matters.

### TRAINING/EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

The Institute organised a large number of training programmes which broadly fall into the following categories:

 Long-term Programmes: Includes Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) for senior officers

- which is conducted for the Training Division of the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), Government of India.
- Sponsored Programmes: Mainly those sponsored by (a) the Department of Personnel and Training, (b) the Ministry of Urban Development, (c) the Department of Science and Technology, (d) the Department of Consumer Affairs, and (e) other Ministries/ Departments, Public Sector Undertakings, etc.
- Fee-based Programmes: Designed and offered by the Institute at the behest of user organisation as well as at its own initiative.

### 46<sup>th</sup> Advanced Professional Programme on Public Administration 2020-2021

### **Brief Report**

The 46<sup>th</sup> Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) would be recorded in the golden leaves of history of IIPA and India as the **first digital APPPA** in the history of IIPA. Sponsored by the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, APPPA serves as a high-end customized ten-months programme for senior officers of the All India and Central Services, conducted by Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) from July 01, every year.

# A very Unique Apppa this Year— The First of its Kind in IIPA / Country

This year was unique in many ways with the turbulence caused by COVID. The programme started on July 01, 2020. Twenty-nine participants participated, majority of them being from all triservices of armed forces and others from ITS, Military Engineer Services (MES) and MoeF and other Civilian Officers.

### Objectives of the Programme

By the end of this APPPA course, the

participants were able to:

- Understand the basic concepts of Social Sciences, Public Policy, and Governance;
- Develop their views on topical issues of Public Administration and Governance ethics in India:
- Analyze the factors that impact the application of policies and modalities;
- Apply analytical skills in decision-making;
- Design a framework for administrative reforms and good governance; and
- Develop interpersonal skills and sensitivity towards the needs of the people.

For achieving the above objectives, the programme was designed in such a way that there were academic - cum - training modules, experiential learning, dissertation writing and vivavoce, besides non - credit inputs for developing ethics, values, critical thinking and creativity. This year, the academic modules were consisted of 33 streams with several additions and enhancements in assuring that it is an all-encompassing coverage.

### Implementation of Digital 46th APPPA

### Onset of Programme: July 1, 2020

The inaugural session of this programme was digitally inaugurated by the Hon'ble Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh. In his speech, he mentioned that APPPA provided an opportunity to the participants from various services and the armed forces to interact with each other and to know and appreciate the background, limitations and difficulties of each other. Further appreciating this programme, he said this uniquely designed digital programme provided a lifetime opportunity to the participants to update their knowledge and inculcate the qualities necessary for improving the citizen-centric service delivery in all aspects.

# Conduct of the Programme (July 2020-April 2021)

There were different academic modules covered in this batch, these modules were related to 33 different multidisciplinary disciplines, revolving around four broad areas. There was a basic module on Theory and Concepts, a thematic

module on Policy, Administration and Governance, and the third one on the Critical Concerns in Governance. Each topic was delivered in blended mode, with online module available, coupled with a MyIIPA video recorded by IIPA faculty, live discussions with online and few offline participants present at IIPA campus.

- A. Academic Modules: During the first half of the APPPA, spanning the first five months, the focus was on concepts and applications. The streams were identified based on their relevance to the issues of governance and recent developments in the respective areas of study. These streams were further divided into three parts, consisting of:
  - A.I: Basic Module: Theories and Concepts
  - A.II: Thematic Module: Policy, Administration and Governance
  - A.III: Public Policy Module: Critical Concerns in Governance.
- B. Learning through Experience: During the programme, participants learnt from each other's interesting experiences in their respective jobs as well as through visits to different places. The purpose of these visits was to expose them to the ground realities concerning the implementation and delivery of various developmental government schemes and programmes through guided study tours in industry and selected rural and urban centres/facilities. The details of these during the 46th APPPA are presented as follows:
- B.1 Experiential Presentations: A meaningful fun-filled experiential exercise. presentations were meant to promote mutual sharing of experiences and expertise among the participants. Each participant prepared a presentation focused on a specific situation an officer had faced at some point in his/her career. These presentations were meant to highlight innovations in internal administration or field situations, practices in organizational leadership or important lessons in project planning and implementation.
- **B.2 Rural Field Study:** To study Rural Development and Administration with

special reference to Aspirational districts, this component was intended to sensitize the participants with the socio-economic realities of rural life. The participants were assigned a theme-based study focussed on flagship progarmmes of Government of India such as Swachch Bharat Abhiyaan, Jan Dhan Yojana, PMJAY, Skill India, etc. and they were expected to examine the effectiveness of the delivery mechanism and assess the impact of rural development programmes. Small groups of participants visited identified rural areas in different parts of the country and interacted with the village level functionaries and panchayat members under the overall guidance of a faculty member. The groups shared their field study reports of these visits which were useful for future policy reference. The rural field study reports were later presented at the IIPA. This year, Punsari, a model village located in Sabarkantha district and Tejgadh, a tribal village situated 90 kms east of Vadodara city in Chhotaudepur district in the state of Gujarat were visited.

B.3 Urban Field Study: To study Urban Development and Administration with special reference to Smart Cities and other Flagship urban development initiatives of Government of India, this visit provided an opportunity for the participants to understand the problems in urban administration and management and the challenges in addressing them. The participants learnt about various urban development schemes and their impact on the socio-economic conditions of the people, especially those below the poverty line. The study also included an interaction with the functionaries of the municipalities and other development agencies. Like rural field study, this group visited specific cities/ towns which were selected based on specific issues in different regions of Ahmedabad, Gandhi Nagar, Bhuj and Kutch districts of Gujarat. The urban study reports too were shared by the groups and served as good policy inputs.

**Forward Area Visit:** The participants were also exposed to ground realities through visits to forward areas establishments of Indian

Army, local government establishments and other institutions in rural and urban areas of border state and districts. For the forward area visits, participants were taken to Sikkim and Darjeeling districts of West Bengal.

#### C. Special Lectures/ Webinars

The participants got the opportunity to listen to and interact with administrators, thinkers and motivators in the webinars organised around a popular theme, APPPA town hall discussions, where with a galaxy of leading academicians, policy-makers were pitted against each other to debate on relevant national concerns and hear strategic perspective of senior most bureaucrats in 'Secretary speaks' series. A special session on "Inner Engineering Technologies for Wellbeing," by Sadhguru Jaggi Vasudev was also organized.

### Convocation Ceremony

The convocation of the 46<sup>th</sup> APPPA was held on April 30, 2021 through virtual mode using WebEx video conferencing facility wherein Secretary DoPT (Shri Deepak Khandekar) had kindly consented to preside it as its esteemed Chief Guest and Vice-Chancellor Panjab University (Prof. Raj Kumar), to be its esteemed Guest of Honour.

At the outset, Shri S. N. Tripathi, Director General, IIPA, shared his vision and impression of this programme with special appreciation for its Programme Directors. This was followed by a brief report of the programme by Programme Director, Dr. Charru Malhotra. In his key convocation address, Shri Deepak Khandekar, emphasized great strides and contribution made by IIPA in sharpening the paradigm of public administration in the country. Similarly, Prof Raj Kumar underscored the unprecedented challenges being faced by the education sector during Covid-19 lockdown and how IIPA had resolutely dealt with these, by successfully conducting Digital 46th APPPA. This beautiful saga of the Digital APPPA concluded with the words of thanks by its co-Director Dr Pawan Taneja.

### LIBRARY

The following activities were carried out during the period under review.

#### **Collection Development:**

During the year 2020-21, 1910 books and 499

bound volumes of periodicals were added to the library. Out of these, 101 books were purchased, 1809 were received as gratis. Around 85 documents were added to the Public Document section. As on March 31, 2021 the library houses 2, 28 lakh volumes of books and bound journals. The Library subscribed 99 current periodicals, 21 newspapers and received 132 periodicals on 'gratis and exchange basis' during the year.

#### · T.N. Chaturvedi Collection:

Library has received around 2700 books from the family members of Late Shri T.N. Chaturvedi on complementary basis. Library has processed these books and created a separate "T.N. Chaturvedi Collection" in the Reference area of the Library.

#### Online Services

#### Subscribed Online Databases:

The Online access to over 21 journals including *Harvard Business Review*, *Economist*, *Time*, *Economic and Political Weekly*, etc. is being facilitated that can be reached through IIPA Library website. Besides this, the library continued subscribing to ABI/Inform, facilitating access to around 4000 titles, out of which 3000 titles are in full text, besides the database facilitates access to about 25,000 dissertations. The Library also subscribed to the 'JSTOR' which is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to helping the scholarly community to discover, use and build upon a range of intellectual content in a trusted digital archive. It provides full-text searches of almost 2,600 academic journals.

#### • In-house Library Online Databases

The computerized library database has 1.38 lakh records relating to books and reports and 1.23 records relating to periodical articles.

All these online journals and databases can be accessed 24x7 across the globe through remotexs software.

#### · Digital Knowledge Repository:

Library has created Digital Knowledge Repository (DKR) showcasing the research output and published resources of the Institute. DKR plays a fundamental role in making accessible the intellectual capital, research output and published resources of the Institute. The objective is to

archive and preserve the intellectual work resulting from the academic and research activity of the Institute, in order to disseminate it in the same via open access. The resources are represented in the form of communities created for various types, such as - Annual General Body Meeting. Presidential Addresses, Faculty Publications, Rare Books, Annual Reports, Special Reports, Thematic Papers, Working Papers and the like. It also includes Theses and Dissertations submitted by APPPA participants for their M.Phil degree, So far 3379 documents have been uploaded in the repository including the full text of top 10 APPPA dissertations from 2008-09 till 2019-20. APPPA lectures comprising 34 modules which include Videos, PPTs, Quiz and reading materials have also been uploaded in the repository.

#### **Library Services:**

As on March 31st, 2021, 1202 documents were loaned out and 1120 volume of documents were received back by the library. computerized library database has 1.38 lakh records relating to books and reports and 1.23 records relating to periodical articles. In addition to 3166 users comprising the Institute's Faculty, IIPA members, participants to various training programmes including the Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA), 1670 bonafide researchers made around use of the library resources under fee-based consultation programme. The Library continued to provide photocopying and internet facility to the members. During the year it made available over 14885 pages of photocopies, and provided bibliographical services to the users.

#### Value added services:

The Library facilitates Current Awareness, Indexing and Abstracting services. The Library regularly brings out Book Alert: a monthly list of additions, Article Alert: a list of significant articles, Weekly News Alert, and Current Contents, to keep its readers informed of the incoming documents and latest information. A quarterly Indexing and Abstracting Journal titled "Documentation in Public Administration, (DIPA)" is being brought out by the Library. It contains indexing of periodical articles, abstracts, book reviews and book notes. During the year 2040 Periodical Articles, 125 Book Reviews and 69 Book Notes were added to DIPA. All the four issues of DIPA for the year 2020 were

brought out on time. Further the library provides bibliographical services to its members and participants of various courses on demand.

#### Participation in National Library Networks:

The Library is an active member of the DELNET-Developing Library Network and has been making considerable use of the network's facilities for inter-library lending, compilation of bibliographies and literature search. As part of this networking endeavour, IIPA Library is also reciprocating in use of its rich resources to other participating network members. During the year, 27 documents were borrowed on inter library loan for the IIPA Library users and 79 documents were borrowed by other libraries through DELNET facility. As part of our reciprocal efficient services, IIPA Library has been adjudged as the best library and awarded Certificate of Appreciation by the DELNET out of 7000 libraries.

# Modernization and Upgradation of IIPA Library Infrastructure:

- Wi-Fi facilities are continued to be provided in the library premises for the use of Library members.
- (ii) Two new computers have been provided for the users in the Library's Reference & Circulation area on the ground floor for resource discovery.

# SIXTY-SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE GENERAL BODY

The 66th Annual Meeting of the General Body of the Institute was held via online/virtual mode on Saturday, the 31st October, 2020 at 4.00 p.m. Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India and President of IIPA presided over the inaugural session and Dr. Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister, DoPT and Chairman IIPA E.C. presided over the second part of the General Body Meeting.

Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu, Hon'ble Vice President of India and President of IIPA presided over the AGM through video conferencing, called for a change in the delivery of services, delivery of justice and the way governance structures respond to the need of common people. He said,

"this is the change India is looking for today". He opined that IIPA as a premier institution of public administration must play a pivotal role in bringing about this change. He expressed happiness that IIPA has continued its activities and conducted training programmes during the pandemic by creating digital infrastructure. He also appreciated the new website launched by IIPA. Shri Naidu unveiled the statue of the former Deputy Prime Minister of India, Shri Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel at IIPA Library. Congratulating the Director General and officers for this achievement, he said the statue should serve as an inspiration to all.

Taking note of the steps initiated by the Executive Council of IIPA to re-position it in the light of current and emerging challenges, Shri Naidu said, "We have to come up with sound strategy for institutional reforms and make IIPA a fit organization to catalyze the new wave of governance reforms in the country". appreciated the amendments and changes in the Memorandum of Association and Rules of IIPA to make the Executive Council leaner, efficient, cost effective and more representative. He welcomed Union Minister, Dr. Jitendra Singh, who took over as the Chairman of the Executive Council of IIPA and hoped that his experience and capability will further enhance the stature of IIPA. He also paid tributes to the former Chairman of IIPA, Shri T.N. Chaturvedi who passed away in January, 2020.

Dr. Jitendra Singh, Chairman, IIPA E.C. in his address mentioned that in the last 5-6 years, a series of reforms were undertaken by the government. He said Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel defined the Civil Service as steel frame and Mission Karmayogi lives up to that vision to reorient our services from time-to-time, depending upon the needs of the nation, the priorities of India, and Karmayogi indeed is an endeavour to shift from the practice of rule to the practice of role so that any job that a civil servant takes up, there could be a provision for capacity building and that too, using the most modern technological modes—online and through Apps.

He complimented the Director General and his team for undertaking a huge digital transformation in the working of IIPA. Today online mechanism which functions without interruption and the evidence of this came out during these Covid times when the show went on even when all other activities under other organizations had been

badly disrupted. He had himself been a testimony to this because the APPPA course conducted by the IIPA was digitally inaugurated by him on the 1<sup>st</sup> of July this year, which was during the thick of this catastrophe. Similarly, a large number of research studies and other courses have been carried on by IIPA.

In his opening remarks, Shri Surendra Nath Tripathi, Director General IIPA, shared in brief, the achievements and the strengths of the Institute for which the employees of IIPA have worked hard. Notwithstanding this Covid pandemic, IIPA has moved on and the regular activities are returning to normal now. IIPA has created the entire required digital infrastructure and prepared the digital contents for online training. It is doing the online trainings for various departments as well as Webinars quite regularly. IIPA facultiy are doing the research and evaluation studies during the pandemic also. Shri Amitabh Ranjan, Registrar IIPA proposed the Words of Thanks.

The Meeting was attended online by 130 members of the Institute against the minimum quorum of 50 members. The House approved the Proceedings of Sixty-fifth Annual Meeting of the General Body held on 18thOctober 2019, the Annual Report, the Annual Statement of Accounts for the year 2019-2020 and the proposed amendments to the Memorandum of Associations and Rules of IIPA.

Sixty-fourth Members' Annual Conference of the Institute was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2020 at 10.00 a.m. via online/virtual mode.

Tripathi, Director General of IIPA, highlighted the significance of the theme. Representatives of Regional and Local Branches expressed their views on the theme. Besides the discussion, papers on the theme were presented during the conference. Prior to holding of the Annual Conference, prelude Conferences/Seminars on the Conference Theme were organized by IIPA Regional and Local Branches at their respective headquarters. # Amendments in the Memorandum of Association and Rules

The General Body in its Annual Meeting held on 31st October, 2020 at 4.00 p.m. approved the amendments to the Memorandum of Association and Rules of IIPA, which were circulated widely in time to the Members, including Supplementary Resolutions as under:

- To amplify the role of President, including the election, Rule 8 is being amended.
- To amplify the role of Hon'ble Chairman, IIPA Executive Council, Rule 9 is being amended to make it ex-officio.
- Executive Council, Rule 13(1) is being rationalized to 16 Members.
- In addition to above, Rule 13(2) E.C. meeting; Rule 13(3) Quorum, Rule 17(2)(viii) Power of E.C.; Rule 21 Special Meeting of the General Body; Rule 22 meeting of AGM; Rule 36(1) Power to amend the MoA; Rule relating to Director as Director-General were amended.
- In addition, some rules/clauses were deleted, i.e. Rule 19(a), 10, 10A, 11, 14, 15, 18(a) & (b) and 30(2), relating to Standing Committee, Academic Committee, elections and many other things. 'Director' shall be replaced with 'Director-General' in the relevant clauses.
- It was also approved to renumber the rules, including editing sentences for grammatical correction, without losing the spirit of the amendment and do the needful things.

The amendments to the rules were necessitated for making the Executive Council leaner, cost-effective and efficient along with maintaining regional representation. The new amendments will help reorient IIPA in the changing world of 21st century and strengthen it.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

During the year, 215 Life Members, 37 Associate Members and 14 Student Members were admitted. The names of 13 Annual Members and 02 Corporate Members whose subscription falls in arrears were removed from the membership rolls of the Institute under Rule 35(1) of the Institute. 22 Life Members have expired during the year.

### CASE STUDY PROGRAMME

The Institute organizes an Annual Case Study Award Competition for promoting Case Studies of high quality which could be utilized for format learning through teaching/training or for self-learning. For 2020-21 all the four case studies were evaluated by the Experts Panel. All the Case Studies were in English and prizes were awarded at the Annual General Body Meeting held on October 31, 2020 virtually. The panel did not find any Case Study suitable for the first prize of Rs. 10,000. The only second prize of Rs. 6000 was jointly given to Ms. Kanchan Gupta and Ms. Smita Nimsarkar for their entry entitled "Naina Town Planning Schemes-Land Owner's Meet in Pre-Covid and Post-Covid Times".

#### INFRASTRUCTURAL IMPROVEMENT

The IIPA is a premier Institute which has its own Hostel Complex in its campus which provides boarding and lodging to participants of the training programmes including the APPPA, its outstation members, guests, bonafide research scholars and officers of educational Institutions and Government departments. The Hostel has 89 rooms and eight APPPA family suites. All the Hostel rooms have ACs, attached baths, toilets and cable TV. The Hostel has been renovated with wooden panelling.

#### THE INSTITUTE'S FINANCES

As shown in the Receipt & Payment Accounts

(Schedule A), during the year 2020-21, the Institute's income was Rs.33.03 crore, as against the expenditure of Rs.33.01 crore. Out of the total income of Rs.33.03 crore, the Institute had received Grant-in-aid Salary/General/Capital of Rs.28.00 crore from the Government.

Thus, after adjusting the cumulative shortfall of Rs.7.33 lakh brought forward from the previous year, the cumulative shortfall as per Schedule A at the end of the year is Rs.5.54 lakh.

The total income from internal resources during the year was Rs.5.04 crore as against Rs. 24.86 crore in the previous year. The receipts of Rs.5.04 crore mainly comprised Training Fee (Rs.1.83 crore), net income from Research assignments (Rs. 2.11 crore), User Charges (Rs. 47.00 lakh), Sale of Publications (Rs.0.25 lakh) etc. Out of the total payments of Rs. 33.01 crore, the Institute's Pay and Allowance was Rs.10.95 crore and Pension Rs. 7.08 crore. The other major items of expenditure were Campus Maintenance (Rs. 2.41 crore), Administrative and Miscellaneous expenses (Rs.51.48 lakh), Training Programmes (Rs.1.05 crore).

The Institute also received a Grant-in-aid (Capital) of Rs.1050.00 lakh from the Government for implementation of various activities of Capital nature, against which total expenditure of Rs.1050.00 lakh was incurred. The main items of expenditure were ICT activities (Rs.73.96 lakh), Library (Rs.18.46 lakh), Strengthening of Regional/Local Branches (Rs.5.05 lakh), Infrastructure development work/Renovation work (Rs.952.53 lakh). The Institute's detailed financial position is given in the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account.

### Pilot Training of Trainers Workshop

Finalisation of ToT modules: A pilot Training of Trainers workshop for finalising the training modules for biodiversity conservation involving key stakeholders i.e., representatives from Forest, Environment and Wildlife Management

Department, Food Security & Agriculture Development Department, Education Department and the like was organised on March 3, 2020 in Gangtok. The objective of the workshop was to enhance capacities of key stakeholders for biodiversity conservation. The workshop was conducted under the chairmanship of Mr. Bhuvan Pardhan, CCF, Forest, Environment and Wildlife Management Department, Govt. of Sikkim. Prof. Vinod K. He spoke about how Chennai, Pune. Surat and Jaipur were selected in the 100 resilient cities list of Rockefeller Foundation and how these cities were preparing themselves to combat natural and man-made disasters including covid-19. CUS also contacted state governments for their cooperation for online engagement on capacity building. It has yielded positive results with many states such as Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, etc. coming forward for signing of MoU and academic assignments.

Virtual platform was created through Moodle and Google Meet, CISCO (Webex), Microsoft Teams, etc. to operate the digital process.

In line with the new normal, CUS also developed unique material for online courses which include videos, PPTs, quiz and reading material placed under IIPA digital platform (Moodle). 35 Modules on different urban themes have been developed and placed in the digital platform.

A separate MoU was also signed with NIUA to have long-term coordination and synergy. Activities have been initiated on information sharing and partnership of NIUA networks on SBM (Swachh Bharat Mission) and Smart Cities Mission.

In line with the focus of Mission Karmayogi, the TNA studies were taken up to assess competency, identified gap and develop content for module accordingly.

The Centre for Consumer Studies is one of the twelve Centres in IIPA and operates within the legal framework of IIPA under the policy directions of the Monitoring Committee chaired by the Secretary, CA, Gol. The role of the Centre is both operational as well as promotional. The Centre for Consumer Studies was set up at IIPA in July 2007 and it is funded by the Department of Consumer Affairs. The Centre has emerged as a Centre for Excellence through its various activities. This is the only Centre of its kind in the country dedicated exclusively for protection and promotion of consumers' right to education. The Centre operates within the legal framework of the IIPA and the policy directions of the Monitoring Committee chaired by the Secretary, CA, Gol. The role of the Centre is both operational as well as promotional. The activities of the Centre include capacity building of various stakeholders. seminars, workshops, research, documentation and dissemination of information. The aim of the Centre is to facilitate consumers' interests and welfare.

The Centre has been recognized as a "think tank" and "Knowledge Partner" of the Department of Consumer Affairs, Gol for research and policy related issues on consumer protection and consumer welfare. The Centre also manages the national Consumer Helpline and the State Consumer Helpline Knowledge Resource Management Portal.

#### 2. Activities of the Centre during the period April 2020- March 2021

## XI. Integrated Consumer Grievance Redressal System through NCH

The Centre also manages National Consumer Helpline (NCH), the grievance redressal mechanism set up by the Department of Consumer Affairs at the Indian Institute of Public Administration to educate and handhold consumers in redressing their consumer related issues and make efforts to resolve their grievances. This alternate redressal mechanism for resolving consumer grievances at NCH is branded as 'Convergence' and has proved to be a successful model for resolving consumer grievances at the pre - litigation level. In January 2019, the State Consumer Helpline Knowledge Resource Management Portal (SCHKRMP) managed by CCS, IIPA, was integrated with NCH and the project is now titled 'Integrated Consumer Grievance Redressal System through NCH".

### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

#### To the Members of Indian Institute of Public Administration

#### **Qualified Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Indian Institute of Public Administration ("IIPA"), which comprise the balance sheet as on March 31st 2021, and Statement of Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended, receipts and payment, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the aforesaid financial statements give the information that the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the institute as on March 31, 2021, and statement of Income & Expenditure and Receipt and Payments for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the entity in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by ICAI and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### We report that,

#### a) Service Tax

IIPA has been requesting the government for waiver of Service tax, being an education institution. However, IIPA has implemented Service tax w.e.f. 1st April 2016, in absence of any response. As explained to us, compliances of service tax prior to 1st April 2016 will be addressed once a response is received. Expert opinion with respect to applicability of service tax prior to 01-04-2016 should be taken.

#### b) Goods and Service Tax

GST matters needs to be reviewed, particularly on the input credit adjustable against provision of service. We are unable to comment on the impact thereof, if any.

#### c) Tax Deducted at source

IIPA has not accounted for TDS on accrual basis. It was observed that TDS liability on expenses payable of Rs 32,537 has not been raised. As explained to us, Liability of TDS will be settled at the time of payment of expenses.

d) Utilisation certificates being provided by the finance department, are based upon statements approved by Project Heads.

#### Further attention is drawn on

"Unutilised Grant Balances" which includes Grant Receivables of 238.05 lakhs upto 2019-20.
 Some of these balances are outstanding since long period. Efforts should be made to recover the same at the earliest.

#### Rent Receivable from NIDM (20%)

There is an outstanding receivable of 2.17 crore from the last 4 years. Efforts should be made to recover the same at the earliest.

Fixed Assets registers are as per GFR Provisions. These should be updated regularly.

#### Accounting Treatment of Fixed Assets acquired out of grant

Presently, Fixed Assets acquired out of grant are capitalised with corresponding credit in Assets fund. In our opinion, value of assets acquired out of grant should be reduced from gross cost of the assets. However, pending final review of the findings of the assets, no effect of the same has been considered by the management.

 There is a huge long-term liability (inclusive of retirement benefits like pension, gratuity, etc.) to the tune of Rs. 121.99 crore. This huge liability is a cause for concern and IIPA should look into ways and means to address this issue.

Responsibilities of Management and those charged with governance for the Financial Statements, are responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the entity in accordance with the accounting principles

generally accepted in India. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

### Report on other legal and regulatory requirement

We report that:

- (i) We have obtained all the information and explanation, which to the best of our knowledge and belief was necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- (ii) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Institute, so far, as appears from our examination of those books.

#### **SCHEDULE 13**

### Significant Accounting Policies and Notes forming part of the Accounts.

#### 1. Background

Indian Institute of Public Administration, established as an autonomous body under the Registration of Societies Act, was inaugurated on March 29, 1954 by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru who was the first President of the Society. The basic purpose of establishing this Institute was to undertake such academic activities as would enhance the leadership qualities and managerial capabilities of the executives in the government and other public service organizations.

#### 2. Method of Accounting

Financial Statement of the Institute has been prepared on "Accrual Basis" which is in accordance with the generally accepted Accounting Principles. Financial Statements are prepared in respect of transaction at Delhi office. The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention unless otherwise stated.

### A) Fixed Assets

- Till 31st March 2012, assets acquired out of own sources were charged to Profit and Loss Account with a corresponding entry in Assets Fund Account in Balance Sheet. However, at the time of conversion of the accounting system from Cash to Accrual in 2012-13, assets acquired from own source has been treated as Capital item and capitalised under the Fixed Assets. Cut-off date for capitalisation has been taken as five year i.e. assets acquired from own source from 1st April 2008 has been capitalised. Value of Land and Building and Books has been captured from the financial records as at 31st March 2013.
- Assets created out of grant received funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where
  the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute, are treated as a Fixed Assets of the
  Institute with a corresponding credit to Asset Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on
  such assets which are acquired out of funds.

#### a) Grants-in-Aid

- Grant-in aid Salary and General received for recurring expenditure is treated as income as and when received.
- Grants-in-aid for Capital Expenditure e.g. Fixed Assets are transferred to Capital Fund.
- Grant in aid for Specified assignment is utilised for the purpose for which such grants received and unutilised grants are carried forward and exhibited as a Liability in the Balance Sheet. In case, expenditure is more than the grant received, then the same is exhibited as Grant Receivable.
- Surplus/ deficit on the research projects / assignments is accounted for in Income and Expenditure account on the completion of the research projects/ assignments.
- In respect of ongoing Sponsored Projects, Research Projects and Programme, expenditure
  of such project are debited to such specified project. Overhead charges recovered from the
  projects are treated as income of the Institute.

- b) Life /Corporate Membership Fee received is not treated as income and instead transferred to specific funds i.e. Life /Corporate Membership Capital Fund.
- c) Interest received on investments made against Life /Corporate Membership Capital Fund is transferred to the respective funds and are not treated as income whereas 50% of the interest received on general funds is transferred to income and balance 50% is shown as payable to branches.
- d) Income on Interest bearing advances to staff for House Building and other advances are accounted for on accrual basis, though the actual recovery of interest starts after the full repayment of the Principal.
- e) Income and expenditure relating to capital fund are credited / debited to respective capital fund.
- f) Assets created out of grants received, funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute, are treated as a Fixed Assets of the Institute with a credit to Capital Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on such assets which are acquired out of funds.
- g) No provision for Income Tax has been considered in view of the tax exemption certificate received from Director General of Income Tax dated 20th Dec 2010
- h) The foreign Currency transactions are translated at the rate prevailing on the date of transactions. However, year-end monetary transactions are stated at the year-end rate.
- j) Income and expenditure from various activities has been accounted for on accrual basis, except for
  - Membership Fee receipt, which is accounted for as and when received.
  - Receipt from Room Hostel is accounted for on Cash Basis.
  - Expenditure on Leave Travel Concession has been accounted for on Cash Basis.
  - Financial Assistance given to branches is treated as expenditure in the year of payment.
  - Sale of Admission form is accounted for on Cash Basis.
  - Royalty received on sale of Publications.

#### 3. Fixed Assets

- Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition (inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes, and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition) less accumulated depreciation.
- Assets created out of Grants received, funds of the Sponsored Projects and programme where
  the ownership of such assets vests in the Institute are treated as a Fixed Assets of the Institute
  with a credit to Capital Fund. However, no depreciation is claimed on such assets which are
  acquired out of funds.

#### 4. Depreciation on Fixed Assets

 Depreciation on other than assets acquired out of the grants received/sponsored fund, has been charged under written down method at the rates specified in Income Tax Act i.e.

_	Vehicle	15%
-	Office Equipment	15%
-	Computer	40%
_	Furniture	10%

- Depreciation is charged @ 50% of the applicable rate in case of assets acquired after 30th September
- Assets costing less than Rs.5000/- are depreciated fully in the year of acquisition.

#### B) Notes to Accounts

- Physical verification of the Fixed Assets has been conducted by th committee constituted by the Institute. For the purpose of the Financial Statement, book balance of the fixed assets has been considered under Fixed Assets.
- ii. No provision has been created for the service tax liability and further no consultancy for the same has been taken.
- iii. Advances for expenses given to staff are subject to confirmation. For the purpose of financial statement, amount recoverable as per financial books has been treated as receivable. Obtaining of the balance confirmation from the staff members / faculty members is in the process.
- iv. TDS has been deducted at the time of payment.
- v. Previous year's figures have been re-grouped, re-cast and re-arranged wherever necessary.


