Guidelines for submission of Papers

1. Original papers based on theoretical or experimental works should be related to the Convention themes.
2. Author(s) should mention their designation along with the institutional affiliation and contact details.
3. The paper should begin with title, short abstract and a list of keywords.
4. The Paper should be typed in MS Word, 12-point Times New Roman and 1.5 line spacing. The Abstract should be limited up to 350 words only and the full paper should be 10-12 pages. References should be in APA style.
5. Simultaneous submissions (papers already submitted to other conferences/journals) are not allowed.
6. The Plagiarism must not exceed the limit of 15% including References.
7. The organizing committee reserves the right to accept or reject the paper at their discretion.
8. Kindly send your Full-length paper on nciipa2022@gmail.com. Papers which would not adhere to the submission guidelines would be rejected.
9. Those who want to present their papers as well as those who want to attend the convention need to register themselves at <https://bit.ly/3RXhID7>
10. The best paper Presentation award for each track shall be selected by the panel of experts.
11. Registration fees is Rs 500 which is inclusive of tea and lunch during breaks for both the days.
