

**Dr. Manan Dwivedi, Executive Summary: Good Governance, Process and Policy in the state of Jammu and Kashmir, 2020 ( Indian Council of Social Science Research, MHA, Government of India)**

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Thus the above data shows that the distribution of the Assembly seats in the J&K region is not balanced. To reduce the blatant gaps, the Central Government must revisit the Delimitation process so as to make way for factoring a self-assured distribution of seats. And for purposes of study, analysis and making recommendations, the entire state needs to be taken as one cohesive

unit. Delimitation of J&K Assembly seats will end partisanship that favours currently one region, which turned the state into 'rotten borough' of valley.<sup>16</sup> Our survey revealed that majority of the people are in favour of the idea that Central Government should go for Delimitation in J&K, however amongst the respondents, a section of the people felt strongly that population should be the prime basis for such an activity,
