Forty-eighth APPPA course inaugurated by Hon'ble Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh

The forty-eighth Advanced Professional Programme in Public Administration (APPPA) was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Union Minister and Chairman of IIPA EC Dr. Jitendra Singh on July 1, 2022. The APPPA course is a 10-month long DoPT programme for middle level Civil Servants and Defence Forces Officers conducted by IIPA.

There are 37 officers in this batch including IAS, Brigadiers, Air and Navy Commodores and other Civil Services Officers. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister emphasized on developing the culture of working with “whole of government approach” in order to provide common solutions and better outcomes. The Minister, who is also the Chairman of Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) said that a more integrated, holistic and synergized approach by IIPA is the hallmark of the training programmes conducted by it, benefitting the participants from different walks of life. Dr Jitendra Singh noted with satisfaction that the APPPA Course has undergone changes and new areas like Atmanirbhar Bharat and Mission Karmayogi apart from other important government initiatives have been covered. He said that it will help the officers in better understanding and appreciation of various socio-economic schemes. During the event, he interacted with the participants of 48th APPPA course. Before the programme, the Minister inaugurated the new APPPA Lecture Hall at IIPA. Director General IIPA, Shri Surendra Nath Tripathi gave the Welcome address for the occasion. Registrar IIPA, Shri Amitabh Ranjan anchored the event. The 48th APPPA course Directors Dr. VN Alok introduced the guests and Dr Kusum Lata proposed the Vote of thanks. The event was attended by the 48th APPPA participants, IIPA faculty and officers.

Workshop for Assistant Secretaries of 2020 batch

A one-day workshop for Assistant Secretaries (2020 batch IAS) was organized on July 29, 2022 at IIPA. Hon’ble Union Minister and Chairman of IIPA EC Dr Jitendra Singh graced the occasion. While addressing the new IAS officers of 2020 batch undergoing 3-month stint as Assistant Secretaries in the Govt of India, the Union Minister redefined their role for 2047. How much will be the role of civil servant, what will be the role of



civil servant and whether at all there will be any role of the civil servant in 2047, is the question, he said. In his concluding remarks, Dr Jitendra Singh told the young civil servants that gaining knowledge from institutions like IIPA will help them to meet the various decision-making challenges, which they will face in the States and the Districts and conveyed his best wishes to officers in all their future endeavours. Shri V Srinivas, Secretary, DARPG delivered a lecture on “Reforms in Governance” during the event. The latest of edition of IIPA Digest was also released during the occasion. The event was coordinated by Shri Amitabh Ranjan, Registrar IIPA and Dr Surabhi Pandey.

Brainstorming session on Mission Karmayogi

The third brainstorming session on Mission Karmayogi was held in IIPA on July 6, 2022. Hon’ble Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh chaired the meeting which attended by representatives of Capacity Building Commission, Department of Administrative Reforms, LBSNAA Mussorie, IIPA and ISTM. During the meeting the Minister said that the DoPT is coordinating institutionalized capacity building of civil servants and for this purpose, an integrated approach is being followed with active involvement of CBC, LBSNAA, IIPA, DARPG and



ISTM. He added, Mission Karmayogi will propose to the government for collaboration, coordination, sharing and action, which is the very essence of Capacity Building Commission. He said, with 60 Ministries, 93 Departments and 2600 organisations, enough demand is likely to be generated for appropriate training of civil servants in tune with the rapidly changing technological landscape.

Annual Decision Making/Teaching Case Study Competition – 2022

The objective of IIPA's Case Study Programme is to build a body of knowledge in governance through case studies with a view to promote deeper and wider understanding of the functioning of Indian Administration in its specific environmental and institutional framework and also to broaden our knowledge and understanding of global and national best practices. In order to develop relevant case studies for use in the learning process, IIPA has renamed its annual case study competition as the Annual Decision Making/Teaching Case Study Competition.

A case study submitted for this competition should aim to facilitate the development of conceptual, behavioural and analytical skills, highlight areas for reform and improvement and promote sensitivity of the readers towards important issues, problems and challenges of public administration and governance. The Case study may cover one or more of the following facets of public administration and governance:

1. State-Specific Studies

Public policy issues and processes such as: conceptualization; planning; implementation; monitoring; evaluation and review of plans; programmes; schemes and projects with special reference to a State;

2. Public Service delivery

Rural Development, Urban Development, Area based development policies, programmes, projects and schemes such as MNREGA, Consumer Awareness, Gender Sensitization, Social Empowerment and Social Inclusion, Digital governance; Swachh Bharat, Ayushman Bharat, COVID and Public Health;

3. Service Sector

Service sectors including physical, social and economic infrastructure development, social services, voluntary organizations, cooperatives, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and Public Private Partnership (PPP); Corporate Social Responsibility, Foundations etc.

4. Contemporary Issues

Disaster Mitigation Strategies, Impact of COVID on Economy, Renewable Energy, Skilling for Re-employment of Migrants, One Nation-One Election, One Nation-One Ration Card, Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan and Social Security.

5. New Age Organisations in Experiential Economy : Theories and Perspectives

The case study must be in two parts.

Part I is to comprise 5-10 A4 size pages typed in double space using size 12 of Times New Roman font and keeping one and half inches margin on each side of the page. **It should consist of a description of an official organizational context concluding with an important decision to be made.** The following information could be provided: the decision to be made – what, why and who has to make it; a brief history of the organization, its vision/mission/values, goals/objectives; the present scenario; key strengths and weaknesses of the organization; challenges, threats and opportunities; influential personalities/groups relevant to the focal decision – their feelings/views (given in quotations) as obtained through interviews or accurately paraphrased. Further, it may also cover socio-political, economic, technological and cultural pressures; group and personality factors - values, attitudes, needs and expectations; skills; organizational reward system; behaviour modeling and example setting by the organisation's leadership and other factors relevant to the focal decision; visualized options/alternatives that seem to be available and their immediate, short term, medium term and long term consequences – the pros and cons thereof. Finally, instead of calling this part of the case study as Part I, it should be given a title based upon either one of the following:-

1. focal organization/department/division/unit/section, programme/project/ scheme;
2. focal decision to be made.

Part II is to comprise 1 – 3 A4 size page(s) typed in double space using size 12 of Times New Roman font and keeping one and a half inches margin on each side of the page. **It should consist of the case writer(s) perceptions of what actually happened** – the decision that was actually made, why, with what expectations, the actual consequences that occurred and any views that the case writer wished to share vis-à-vis the case and the important learning – problems/concepts/ insights and or skills – that the case may be utilized for imparting in the teaching/training process. Finally, instead of calling this part of the case study as part II, it should be entitled: **Perceptions of the Case Writer (s).**

An executive summary of the case study is to comprise 1 – 2 A4 size page(s) and typed in the same way as Parts I and II mentioned earlier. Three copies each of the case study (i.e., Parts I and II) and the executive summary are to be submitted.

Each case study should be accompanied by the following information: title of the case study; name of the case writer (s); address and telephone(s) of the Case Writer(s) and fax/email where available. **The case writer(s) should also state whether the case study has been approved for publication by the concerned organization or whether approval is yet to be taken; and, finally, the signature(s) of the case writer(s).**

The competition has a first prize award of Rs.10,000, a second, prize award of Rs. 6,000 and a third prize award of Rs. 4,000/-. Excluding the award winning case studies, any other case studies that are considered suitable for publication shall be given an honorarium of Rs. 2,000/- each.

Any individual or not more than two authors may submit a case study to the Institute for the competition. In case of joint authorship, the award will be equally distributed. However, each individual may submit only one entry for the competition either individually or jointly. **An individual who has been awarded prize in the last 5 years is not eligible to participate in the competition.**

A case study submitted for the competition must fall within the broad areas specified and be in the format prescribed above. The case study should not have been published elsewhere as the copyright will vest with the Institute and the writer, if the case study is selected for award/publication.

The last date for the receipt of the case study is 9th September, 2022. The cover should be superscribed with “**Annual Decision Making/Teaching Case Study Competition – 2022**” and be addressed to the Registrar, Indian Institute of Public Administration, Indraprastha Estate, Ring Road, New Delhi – 110002.

MEMBERS' ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The 66th Members' Annual Conference of IIPA will be held during the month of October, 2022. The theme/subject of the Conference is **"India Emerging as a Global Leader"**. All the members of the IIPA are eligible to submit their papers on the theme.

The length of the papers should be between 1500-3000 words in typescript. Papers exceeding this limit will be returned to the authors. All papers must be accompanied by a synopsis of about 300-400 words in typescript, which is intended to be a comprehensive summary of the paper giving in brief the most important issues being emphasized. The synopsis is intended to be read out at the Annual Conference. Papers without a synopsis will be returned to the authors.

Entries may be sent to the Director General, IIPA or Research Coordination Unit at its email: **rcu-nitiipa@gmail.com**. The last date for receipt of entries is 18th September, 2022. Papers received thereafter will not be considered.

The papers will be scrutinized by a committee of experts. Only those papers which are accepted for presentation will be circulated. However, synopses of all the papers will be circulated.

As already communicated, all Regional/Local Branches may organize prelude conferences on the theme preceding the Annual Conference. The Regional/Local Branches will make a presentation of synopses/summaries of reports of the regional conference during the Annual Conference.

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




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PERIODICALS
